2A & 1A Unchanged

Since 1999/2000 the Kenai varsity girls have beaten Wasilla one time, Palmer three times and have never beaten Colony. The varsity boys have beaten Wasilla one time, Colony boys twice, and Palmer boys four times.

Since the region has gone to an eight team format with Colony coming online, there has not been a Region III champion come from the peninsula for either gender.

Over the course of the past four years, the boy's varsity team has a 15-10 record against teams that are currently classified as 3A schools, a 24-13 record against peninsula /Kodiak 4A schools, and a 6-19 record against Anchorage and valley 4A schools. This data represents a 07/08 team that finished 4th at state. This team finished the year 3-1 against 3A team, 9-1 against peninsula/Kodiak 4A schools, and 4-7 against the valley and Anchorage schools. If you remove this year from the data, our records would be as follows: 12-9 vs 3A schools, 13-12 vs peninsula/Kodiak 4A schools, and 2-12 vs Anchorage/valley 4A schools.

I was a head coach for girls and boys basketball at Kenai for 19 years and in that period teams that I coached have qualified for the state tournament four times.

In the history for 4A boys basketball there has never been a peninsula team win a state championship. As for the girls, Kenai won in 1990/91 and Soldotna won in 1992/93.

In volleyball there has never been a state champion come from a peninsula 4A team. Based on the information on ASAA's website, Homer has qualified for state 3 times, Soldotna 4 times, Skyview 4 times and Kenai 2 times. Skyview took 2nd in 2001 and Homer took 2nd in 1992/93. The rest of the teams finished in fourth place or lower.

My understand is that the point of the reclassification committee is to make things competitive and based on the information presented I think it is appropriate to say Kenai and Soldotna fit more with the 3A group then the 4A group for both volleyball and basketball. Are they using winning championships as the criteria or what? It appears that football is being changed not because teams are not qualifying for state but because they are not winning state. At this point in time, Kenai and Soldotna have the same complaint about where they are playing in volleyball and basketball as Skyview and Homer or the other smaller schools in football.

By moving the number for 3A to 600 Kenai and Soldotna would be joining the south central league which would give it 10 teams. The league could be divided into two halves and an eight team region tournament could be played with a play in game for the bottom two teams in each half.
