- APPROVAL OF AGENDA: The agenda was approved with the deletion of Item 8g, Approval of Capital Improvement Projects, and the addition of Item 7c, Legislative Report.
- APPROVAL OF MINUTES: The School Board Minutes of February 15, 1993, were approved with a correction.
- HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:
- Mrs. Cleta Johnson, Nikiski resident, told the Board that one in four girls will be raped or molested before the age of 16, and she felt the district's health curriculum did not help matters by exploiting women. She felt young women should be taught information by police departments on rape prevention, testifying in rape cases, etc.
- Mrs. Beverly Berdahl, Nikiski resident, read excerpts from "Children at Risk" where the authors felt humanistic thinking is capturing education and is a breakdown to the nation's Christian heritage.
- SKYVIEW HIGH SCHOOL PTSA:
- Mr. Ken Tarbox, Skyview High School PTSA chairperson, introduced the committee's student representative, Molly Davis, who presented the results of a student survey conducted at their school. Miss Davis reported 350 students responded to the survey. The results indicated that the 75% of the students were involved in extracurricular activities and clubs at Skyview High, 89% of the students stated they were satisfied with the school's activities, 89% of students indicated they were satisfied with their teachers, 93% of the respondents indicated they were happy with the education they were receiving at their school, and 63% felt they had a voice at the school. School pride and a happy school atmosphere was evident from students' comments expressed.
- Mr. Tarbox expressed appreciation to the Council of PTAs for the worksession they presented on Saturday, February 27.
- SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Holmes reported the replacement of principals continued for Chapman Elementary, Homer High, Nikolaevsk Elem/High,

Ninilchik Elem/High and English Bay Elem/High. He commended Mrs. Radtke and the instructional team for their work in previewing candidates prior to the formal interview.

He reported the 1993-94 budget would be delivered to the Borough Assembly on March 15 which is not a meeting, but an administrative function.

Dr. Holmes reported Strategic Planning sessions will be held March 8-10 at the Kenai Bicentennial Visitor's Center. He noted applications for action team member candidates will be re-advertised. Meetings for the action team are scheduled to begin in April. He announced the following have been selected for the strategic planning committee: Betty Obendorf, Mari-Anne Gross, Robert Holmes, John Dahlgren, Mary Rubadeau, Mo Scott, Richard DeLorenzo, Malcolm Fleming, Tom Thorpe, Betty Leonard, Paula Christensen, Zada Friedersdorff, Bonnie Evans, Amy Budge, Theo Lexmond, Bob Brown, Larry Willard, Rick Bell, Steve Gibson, Colleen Pillon, Kathy Godek, Kenneth Tarbox, Merrill Sikorski, Dean Nichols, Lamar Helm, Kathy Scott and Bob Williams. The finalized Strategic Plan will be presented to the Board in December, 1993.

PAUL BANKS  
ELEMENTARY SCHOOL  
REPORT:

Mr. Lewis McLin, Principal, Paul Banks Elementary School, presented a 12-minute video on events occurring within his school for the past seven days. He noted the K-3 elementary school has 341 students with a special education component for the Homer area. He noted volunteers are a vital part of the school's programs with approximately 100 parent volunteers per week helping in various tasks. He announced that Caroline Bacus' class was awarded a \$1,000 first place award from Scholastic Magazine for their project "Kids Care". In addition to creative and outstanding classes being taught, the school teaches 4 to 5 foreign languages each year.

HOPE SCHOOL  
HOT LUNCH  
REPORT:

Mr. Swarner reported the subsidy for a hot lunch program at Hope Elementary School would be \$8,270. He noted the costs for providing a hot lunch program at Hope were higher than anticipated and funds have not been provided for this in the proposed 1993-94 school budget.

Mr. Wiley commented that Hope parents would like a hot lunch program at their school, but would opt not to have the program if it reduced their academic funding.

## LEGISLATIVE REPORT:

Mrs. Dimmick reported she attended the AASB Legislative Fly-In in Juneau last week. She commented that school board members met with the Governor and it was encouraging hearing his opinion on funding for construction and maintenance of school facilities. She stated that attitudes of legislators towards education was a refreshing change from the past. She noted the funding bill, HB45, passed the House and had been sent to the Senate.

**CONSENT AGENDA:** Items presented on the Consent Agenda were Approval of Sick Leave Request/Certified, Extended Field Trip Requests, Resignations, and Participation in School Board Legal Fund.

**SICK LEAVE REQUEST/CERTIFIED:** Mrs. Radtke recommended the Board approve a draw of 20 half-days from the KPEA Sick Leave Bank for Lisa Schmitter, Counselor, Soldotna Junior High.

**EXTENDED FIELD TRIP REQUESTS:** Mrs. Rubadeau recommended the Board approve extended field trip requests for three Skyview students to travel to Washington, D.C. for Close-Up Program activities, May 8-15, 1993; and for eight Soldotna High School Japanese language students to travel to Tokyo, Japan, May 31-June 9, 1993 for an educational cultural experience.

**RESIGNATIONS:** Mrs. Radtke recommended the Board approve resignations effective the end of the 1992-93 school year for Ginny Davis, English/Drama, Soldotna High; and Marilyn Nelson, Principal/Teacher, English Bay Elem/High.

**PARTICIPATE IN AASB LEGAL FUND:** Approval to enter into agreement with the Association of Alaska School Boards for their Legal Trust Fund was submitted. Annual cost of the program would be \$500.

**ACTION** Mrs. Gross moved the Board approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Mrs. Dimmick seconded.

Motion carried unanimously.

**STUDENT EXPULSION:** Mrs. Rubadeau reported an expulsion hearing had been conducted at 4:30 p.m. regarding a Homer High School student. The student was recommended for expulsion for the 1993-94 school year for violation of Policy 007.1, Student Conduct, and 007.12, Substance Abuse.

**ACTION** Mr. Tauriainen moved the Board expel BB for the remainder of the 1992-93 school year subject to all conditions recommended by the hearing officer. The student admits having a loaded firearm in his car on school grounds and being involved with vehicles stolen from school grounds. These actions constitute a serious breach of acceptable conduct in a school setting and present a serious and immediate danger to other students and persons. Continued presence in a school would be inimical to the orderly conduct of school programs and a continuing threat to the safety and welfare of other students and their property. Mr. Arness seconded.

STUDENT EXPULSION:

Mrs. Rubadeau reported a hearing was held at 5:15 p.m. related to expulsion of a Homer High student. The student was recommended for expulsion for violation of Policy 007.1, Student Conduct.

Mr. Tauriainen moved the Board expel KP for the remainder of the 1992-93 school year subject to all conditions recommended by the hearing officer. The student admitted stealing two cars from campus and having "co-ownership" of a loaded firearm that was present in another student's vehicle. He was aware of the presence of the firearm and had access to it. These actions constitute a serious breach of acceptable conduct in a school setting and present a serious and immediate danger to other students and persons. Continued presence in a school would be inimical to the orderly conduct of school programs and a continued threat to the safety and welfare of the students and their property. Mrs. Dimmick seconded.

POLICY REVISION/  
007.11R, STUDENT  
HANDBOOK:

Mrs. Rubadeau recommended the Board approve revisions to Policy 007.11R, Student Handbooks. She noted the principals had reviewed the revisions and had no further suggestions for change. Administrators felt the inclusion of the word "and" following the first recommendation was time consuming for administrators if required.

Mr. Jackson questioned whether copies of student handbooks could be mailed to parents for their review. Mrs. Rubadeau responded that postage would be costly and was not included in the budget for this purpose. Each student receives a copy of the student handbook and they are expected to take it home to review with their parents.

Mrs. Carla Anderson, Soldotna High School PTA Chairperson, expressed concern that the handbooks often do not contain the same student conduct policies required for student activities and school board policy. She noted students should be aware that different conduct expectations may be required for different activities.

Mr. John Kistler stated the word "and" should be placed in the policy in order for parents to review the handbook. He stated sometimes students do not receive copies of the handbook within the timeframe needed. He felt a mechanism should be available to parents so they will know when handbooks will be available for the students and parents to review.

ACTION Mr. Tauriainen moved the Board approve revisions to Policy 007.11R, Student Handbook. Mrs. Dimmick seconded.

Mr. Tauriainen commented that both parents' comments were important, and notification should be made to parents. Mrs. Rubadeau responded that notification to parents could be incorporated into administrative guidelines. Mr. Dahlgren commented that KPSAA has higher expectations for students who represent our communities as they travel to different areas. He noted each participant receives a copy of the KPSAA procedures, and students and parents sign off on them. Mrs. Dimmick suggested a section be included on KPSAA regulations in future handbooks. Mrs. Obendorf reminded Board members that they will consider KPSAA regulations later in the year.

Motion carried unanimously.

RECONVENE AFTER RECESS: At 9:02 p.m., the Board reconvened in regular session.

POLICY REVISION/  
003.121R/FIELD  
TRIPS: Mrs. Rubadeau commented the Board had reviewed Policy 003.121R, Field Trips, and requested a section on guidelines for field trips abroad be added to the policy. She noted a section needed to be added on trips abroad related to travel by boat and aircraft since these are regulated by international standards, not U.S. Coast Guard and FAA regulations.

Mr. Tauriainen commented that items #3, #4, and #5 of the field trips abroad applied to all field trips and should be included in the extended field trip section of the policy.

Miss Renee Henderson, KCHS choir director, told the Board that section #3 related to the number of chaperones and funding of substitutes might be abused if a principal did not want to fund substitutes and required the group to raise these funds. She questioned whether a ratio of chaperones to students had been considered. Some Alaskan school districts require 1 chaperone to 6 students.

Mr. John Kistler stated the policy was vague on type of medical policy needed to cover students on trips abroad. Mrs. Rubadeau responded students are required to be covered by medical insurance. Organizers of the groups make available short term insurance policies to parents to cover their students' needs.

Mr. Nate Anderson, student, stated he was appreciative that the school board had revised the policy in a manner that made it possible for student trips abroad. He stated he was pleased the 1 to 6 ratio was not included in the policy, thus making student trips practical.

Mrs. Dimmick moved the Board approve Regulation 003.121, Field Trips. Mr. Tauriainen seconded.

**ACTION**

Mrs. Dimmick moved the Board postpone action on the motion until March 15. Mr. Tauriainen seconded.

**TITLE V GRANT  
APPLICATION:**

Mrs. Rubadeau recommended the Board approve the Title V, Indian Education Grant application, for the 1993-94 school year. The grant application requested \$229,676 which would be used for tutorial services to provide instructional support to 143 students in grades K-12, provide cultural activities for four elementary schools and cover expenses to send a team of district representatives to the Native Youth Olympics in Anchorage.

Mr. Tauriainen commented that the goal for the third year of the project is for 75% of students to meet program objectives. He stated this indicated 25% of the students failed the objectives. Mrs. Rubadeau commented that this is the third year of the grant and it was intended that the program maintain the criteria for the plan in place. It is anticipated a new plan will be in place with different assessment parameters for the next three year plan. Mr. Matiya explained the assessment criteria used for the program.

**ACTION**

Mr. Wiley moved the Board approve the Title V Grant application as submitted by Mr. Matiya. Mr. Arness seconded.

1993-94 SCHOOL  
BUDGET:

Dr. Holmes recommended the Board approve the 1993-94 school budget in the amount of \$76,577,508. He noted the "bare bones" budget was balanced, but contained no unallocated funds for unexpected classroom enrollments.

Mr. John Kistler, parent, recommended the Board remove all funds from extracurricular travel and transfer the funds to unallocated teachers. If funds are not needed after school begins the money could be transferred back to the accounts where needed.

ACTION

Mr. Massie moved the Board approve the 1993-94 Budget as presented. Mrs. Dimmick seconded.

Mr. Tauriainen commented there was a lot of money in the budget which equated to approximately \$8,000 per student. He added that dollars spent per student do not necessarily translate into performance. He stated Alaska is one of the top spending states and among the lowest in performance.

Mrs. Dimmick commended the budget committee and administration for their work on the budget. She stated there is a real concern shown for good education on the peninsula. She reminded the Board that only the House of Representatives has

passed a funding bill at the level of which the budget is based. She noted there was a possibility that additional funding could be gained from the area cost differential bill if that is approved.

Mrs. Obendorf expressed appreciation to the administration and budget committee who worked on the budget. She commented she was pleased that people attended the budget hearings.

Motion carried unanimously.

PUBLIC  
PRESENTATIONS:

Mr. John Kistler commented he had prepared a paper on how the Board can accomplish better communications without additional labor costs. He stated he would like to see the Board just once put student education ahead of sports. He commented the Board had funds they could allocate back and forth if they so desired, and that parents have requested lower PTR's as their priority for the budget.

BOARD COMMENTS:

Mr. Wiley called the Board's attention to an ordinance to be introduced at the March 2 Borough Assembly meeting to increase the number of school board members from seven to nine. A public hearing on this would be held on April 6.

Mrs. Gross complimented Mr. McLin for his presentation on Paul Banks Elementary School. She noted it is an exciting school and she was pleased with the atmosphere created at the school for the handicapped students.

Mr. Tauriainen thanked Mrs. Berdahl for the video she showed the Board on the nation's Christian heritage.

Mr. Jackson thanked Miss Davis for her report on the Skyview High School student survey. He reminded the Board of the Mass Band Concert at Soldotna High School on Tuesday, March 2. The State Mock Trial Competition will be held in Anchorage this weekend.

Mr. Arness noted a listener on "Sound Off" called about utility usage in the school district. He requested a worksession be held on this in the near future.

He noted electronic transfer is most likely possible within the district, and this is something that should be researched.

Mr. Arness noted that Mr. Kistler had remarked there were large sums of money spent on "dumb jocks" in the educational system. He responded there are many intelligent students in the district who are also athletically inclined. He did not feel it was necessary to categorize people.

BOARD COMMENTS  
(continued):

Mrs. Obendorf stated she attended the Mass Choir Concert last Tuesday, and was impressed seeing all the choirs on stage with their different choir robes. She commented they performed excellently.

She requested a worksession be held on utility usage at the next meeting. She further requested the administration respond to what is being done in this area. She also requested a worksession be held on communications.


