



Last April's SBA results-we're headed in the right direction


 Average Scale Score inched up in reading, writing and math

 Average Scale Score in reading is close to the advanced level


Science scores still need improvement

SBA Scale Score Averages 2005 - 2011




Comparison of % of KPBSD Students Proficient or Advanced with Alaska's Students




Adequate Yearly Progress
