Today's enrollment: 8851 (235 under projection)


Note: Connections 68 less than projection Spring Creek 44 less than projection



Enrollment by Grade (9-6-11)




KPBSD Students' SBA Scores Keep Inching Up


SBA Averages 2005 - 2011

Funding- As usual, not clear on what to expect for the coming year

Considerations

- Recent state increases for education have been outside of the funding formula-we cannot count on anything other than FY11 level of funding
- Fate of federal entitlement money (about \$9 million to district) is unknown. Appears to be a chance that this amount could be drastically reduced.

FY13 Budgeting Process

- KPBSD's budget committee will meet October 26. Two assembly members are invited to be a part of this meeting.
- Purpose of meeting is to review our annual budget process and to look for suggestions on how to improve.
- District would like to continue to work with the Assembly on the process for calculating the amount of local funding.
- As we did last year, we are hopeful that the Assembly can set a minimum level of funding for the District in February or March

Looking Ahead

- Board will revise Board Policy 0201(a) which sets the learning goals for the district (last revised in 1996)
- District's 5-year plan ends in June- we will be setting a new 5-year plan for the district
- Collective bargaining agreements with certified and support staff end in June. Bargaining can begin January 1, 2012
