The Kenai Peninsula will always be home to me and my family and I look forward to volunteering my time and perhaps substitute teaching in our local peninsula schools.



320 PERSONAL LEAVE

Teachers formally retiring from the teaching profession with vested service in the Alaska Teachers Retirement System may choose from the two following options: (1) receive a cash settlement for their accrued personal leave days. This amount shall be the number of accrued personal leave days times their per diem rate; or (2) may submit a request no later than November 1 to exchange up to five (5) personal leave days for a contract extension for site level approved projects. The remainder of personal leave would be eligible for cash out at the per diem rate.

Dear Mr. Peterson & Members of the KPBSD School Board,

It is with much gratitude for the privilege of serving in this district for the past 22 years, that prespectfully request your acceptance of my intent to retire from my position as a kindergarten teacher at Sterling Elementary at the end of the 2011-12 school year. I would like to take a few moments to reflect on this most amazing and fulfilling career.

In the summer of 1990, after serving my first year of teaching in a temporary position on Annette Island, I brought my husband and 4 young children to the Kenai on the advice of my superintendent, Dr. Walt Bromenshenkel. Not sure of what I was going to do next, he said, "Suzanne, go to the Kenai Peninsula. It's the best school district in the state!" After camping in a tent on the Kenai the entire summer, moving from campground to campground from Bing's Landing in Sterling to Johnson Lake in Tustemena and "living" at central office to check the latest job openings, I finally landed my first teaching job here, with the help of HR director, Sharon Radtke. From 1990-93 my family and I thoroughly enjoyed living in the village of Port Graham. We have great memories of the whole family riding on a 3 wheeler with a small trailer in tow delivering homemade Christmas bread to the villagers. We loved participating in the customs and traditions of the people, celebrating and participating in the Russian Orthodox Christmas & New Year's celebrations. But what I will always remember the most is the way the villagers welcomed us into their community and the respect they gave me as a teacher. Many remain friends today.

In 1993, I came across the water to teach in the Russian Old Believer village of Kachemak Selo. After driving the long distance of gravel, icy, snowy or very muddy roads for two years, I dubbed the "parking lot" at the top of the switchback trail, "The Real End of the Road!" The hike down the steep trail and then along the beach to the village was often tedious & treacherous, but on beautiful clear days, I would look out over the pristine waters of Kachemak Bay to the rugged snowcapped mountains and glaciers and proclaim to myself, "How lucky can I get! This is the best teaching job in the world!" I will always have many fond memories of my non English speaking kindergarten students who made it their mission to teach Russian to their teacher!

However, ever since our camping days at Bing's Landing or Isaac Walton, we would drive past Sterling Elementary School on numerous occasions and I just got the strong impression that this was my school; this is where I wanted and needed to be. Finally, in 1995, after 5 years in the KPBSD, my dream became a reality. I found myself driving just a few miles from my home in Sterling, right up to the front door of the school. No backpack to don, no headlight to turn on, and no long hike to make. For months I felt like I was dreaming! Now, after 17 incredible years of being a part of the "Fabulous Falcon Family", it is time to move on. I am not sure what "moving on" entails at this point but one thing is for certain; as did her 4 siblings before her, my youngest daughter will complete the rest of her education right here on the Kenai.

I am most grateful to the many teachers and principals along the way who have inspired me and helped me grow to achieve my best. Although too numerous to mention, a few that stand out in my mind include:

- <u>Joe & Andrea Deutsch</u>, in Port Graham. Joe was a great mentor and believed in my abilities not only as a K-3 teacher but as a non-certified music teacher as well! Having daughters of similar age, Andrea & I worked together to create the first Girl Scout Troop in the village.
- Randy Creamer, the principal in Kachemak Selo, who not only gave me lots of space to grow, but who patiently pulled my old Colt Vista out of the mud or snow on numerous occasions!
- <u>Michele Stenger</u>, my friend & hiking buddy who walked with me almost every morning into Kachemak Selo and still hikes the switchback trail today after nearly 20 years!
- Lora Sterling who has been the "teacher next door" for all of my tenure at Sterling and who has inspired me year after year with her love for and knowledge of young children and her creative ability to scaffold children's learning.
- <u>Sandy Lyons</u> who encouraged me to join with her to pursue a Master's Degree in Early Childhood Education from UAS. At the time it was one of the most rigorous programs in the state but with her encouragement, we did it!
- **<u>Dr. Christine Ermold</u>**, my current principal who right before my eyes transformed Sterling from a school of obscurity to a nationally recognized school. What a privilege and an honor it has been to teach under her expert guidance for over 1/3 of my career!
- And finally, my husband Dan, who is one of the finest "Mr. Mom's" on the planet. He supported me from the beginning by always being there for our kids and by being my "right hand"; creating things for our classroom, shopping for supplies, coming in to help out for special projects or bringing things to school that I forgot! He has been on dozens of field trips over the years and was always willing to lend a hand to any. If only every teacher could have someone like him!

Dr. Walt Bromenschenkel, who encouraged me to take the leap of faith and come to the Kenai, practiced what he preached. In 1994, he himself came to the "best school district in Alaska" and served as our superintendent for several years. I will always be most grateful for his advice because coming to the Kenai was certainly one of the best decisions I have ever made. I will treasure each and every teaching experience and always be grateful for the opportunity to serve the hundreds of children, (including my own), that have passed through my classroom doors.
