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#### **Skills**

### Beginner:

- Perform level .5-1 music, with appropriate posture, fingerings, embouchure, and characteristic tone.
- Sight-read accurately a unison melody at a .5 level.
- Will be able to play music in 2/4, 3/4, and 4/4 time.
- Play a 5 note scale (Concert Bb-F), quarter notes ascending and descending.
- Perform a varied repertoire of music.
- Identify and perform simple dynamic contrasts.
- Perform in scheduled concerts in appropriate concert attire with appropriate concert behavior.

#### Novice:

- Be able to play music in 2/2, 6/8 time.
- Sight-read accurately, music with a difficulty level of 1.
- Perform music with a difficulty level of 1.5.
- Perform from memory the following scales: Bb, F, One Octave Chromatic Scale
- Identify and perform musical phrases.
- Identify and perform dynamic contrasts and tempo markings indicated in the score.
- Use self-reflection and peer feedback to refine individual and ensemble performances.

#### Intermediate:

- Perform music with a difficulty level of 2-3.
- Sight-read accurately, music with a difficulty level of 1.5.
- Perform from memory the following scales: Bb, F, Ab, C, and a One Octave Chromatic Scale.
- Identify and perform dynamic contrasts, tempo markings, and phrasing indicated and implied in the score.
- Develop strategies to address technical challenges and evaluate the success of those strategies.

## Advanced:

- Perform music with a difficulty level of 3-6.
- Sight-read accurately, music with a difficulty level of 2.5.
- Perform from memory the following scales: G, C, F, Bb, Eb, Ab, and Db, Chromatic Scale over the full range of the Instrument.
- Be able to play in various mixed-meters and compound meters.
- Perform expressively, subtle dynamic contrasts and tempo markings in phrasing throughout a piece of music, appropriate to the style, genre, and context.

All levels build upon previous levels.
