#### I. Opening Activities

- A. **Call meeting to order & Pledge of Allegiance** Meeting called to order at 2:45
- B. **Roll Call** Principal/staff/teachers/parents-All were invited, including community members.
- C. **Approval of Minutes – September 13, 2023** Approved after finishing a sentence to old business under Rec Room.
- D. **Approval of Agenda** Requested to add an 'I' to talk about the upcoming conferences and book fair. This was approved.

#### II. Principal's Report

##### School News

- a. **Enrollment** On Oct 2<sup>nd</sup>, enrollment was 154 students. The district is taking an October 20 day count to see where schools are and if we are good on staff/etc.
- b. **Hiring** Stipend positions open for Battle of the Books, Classified/Certified filled 100%.
- c. **New Staff** Cara Long/Mary Stover (Sped Aides)

- e. School Goals for 2023-2024
  - i. Academic:
    - 1. By spring benchmark, the K-2 will have 50% or less below benchmark, by ensuring students are getting their allotted intervention times. Currently, 73.3% of our students are below or well below on reading indicators. **Same assessments used at the beginning of the year as the end of the year.**
    - 2. For 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade, Increase median percentile score by 8% by the Spring MAPS benchmark. After the Fall MAPS test, 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> class median percentile score for reading was 51%. Our goal is to see this increase to 59% percent by the Spring benchmark. **All students work together for this goal by taking the average from 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade.**
    - 3. 90% of 6-8 students will achieve their projected growth goal in Reading by Spring of '24. **Teachers help create the goals for what they hope to reach. It is an in-house goal but if it is not met, teachers do a reflection. Goals will be reevaluated after the next testing results.**

  - ii. **Social Emotional: Students will participate in one targeted social emotional lesson per week. Counselors & teachers are making sure to teach the class one lesson per day.**

iii. Fostering a Sense of Community:

1. Students will participate in one service-learning project a semester. 6-8<sup>th</sup> did a service project by clearing the brush at the golf course.
2. Staff will host one family education night per quarter. 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers will host the next Family Ed Night on November 29<sup>th</sup>. Migrant Ed will participate as well.

B. Quest Services

- a. Mind A-Mazes A group of parents met and helped meet the need to provide help to the students for Mind-A-Mazes.

C. Improvements:

- a. Capital Projects Update- CIP Inspection- Parking lot, portables, ceiling tiles, siding on the back of the school, Lack of space Have not made a lot of progress on parking lot/field. Maintenance said they could take some of our field to expand parking and we said that will not work. Had them walk through the portables to witness the smell. Let them know that to not have the smell, windows have to be open all day and that makes the rooms cold. Need a plan for Anchor Points growing population. Placement of the new portable creates terrible ice paths from the water that drips off and makes for a very unsafe area for our students/staff. New wrestling mats & lift will be coming.
- b. Electronic Door Opening system- in progress Electronic door systems are the future plans for all doors. This will slowly take place after all front doors of schools are finished being installed.

D. 8<sup>th</sup> grade trip to Yellowstone

- a. Purchasing Plane Tickets- \$6,500 for plane tickets-Lodging is a flat cost of \$5,000. Waiting for a possible scholarship that was applied for. With scholarship will need \$4,000 more and without scholarship will need \$9,000. May reach out to Homer Foundation for sponsorship. Casey Eberle made a Go Fund Me page for it & currently at \$600.00. Had a KBBi news article written on the trip.

E. Basketball Games

- a. Tournament @ Chapman November 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> Talked about what Chapman needs to do to prepare for tournament. Help is needed for concessions, hospitality room, table clock (HHS service hrs,) gatorade coolers, subcommittee needed for tournament planning.
- b. Opportunity to showcase Chapman Showcase Homer Opus/Band. Ms. Simondsen collaboration for tournament game. Fundraiser for Yellowstone 8<sup>th</sup> grade trip.

G. School District Updates

- a. Linewize New software to monitor/block computer sites of students. Able to access each individual student's history. This can be done in real time. Shows students google searches. This program also monitors trends and will tag for things such as

depression/aggression/violence based off search history. The next step in the there year plan will be to allow teachers to have monitor over students in real time.

- c. **Budget 101 meetings** If you cannot not make the meetings in person they are recorded to view when able. Each scheduled budget meeting covers a different subject. Getting the info to stay informed will help with advocacy.
- d. **School Board Visit- Tim Daugharty** He was super impressed with our school and the projects we are doing.

- a. **Behavior Threat Assessments, Bullying, Suicide Risk Assessments** Every child is exposed at some point. Need to build resiliency and school is the place to do that when they are here.
- b. **Sources of Support Inventory** 2x10 challenge. Make sure every kid can have 2 positive interactions for 10 days.

I. Conferences/Book Fair

- a. **Parent conferences** 8-7 pm on Thursday 6-8<sup>th</sup> in person in the gym with rotation between teachers. 8-12 on Friday, 6-8<sup>th</sup> only call parent/teacher conferences.
