



Dear Parent(s), Guardian(s), and Students:

Each school day over 8,000 students attend our 42 schools. While at school, the safety and security of your child(ren) is always our number one priority. As a way to ensure this, the school district and the borough have installed security cameras at your child(ren)'s school. This letter is written to advise you that the cameras are located in public areas inside and outside of the school buildings. Please note that no cameras are placed in areas where students, staff, or community members have a reasonable expectation of privacy, e.g., a bathroom or a locker room.

School security is the main purpose for the cameras. However, recordings may be used in disciplinary proceedings. In addition, matters captured by the cameras may be referred to local law enforcement, as appropriate.

SUBJECT: AHERA School Management Plans

As mandated by Federal Regulation 40 CFR PART 763, known as AHERA (the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, enacted in 1987), local educational agencies must notify parents/guardians/students in writing each school year about the existence and location of AHERA School Management Plans for each school building within their jurisdiction.

Currently, copies of all AHERA School Management Plans are located at the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's Central Office and at the Kenai Peninsula Borough Maintenance Office. Each school's administrative office also maintains a copy of the individual AHERA Management Plan for that school. AHERA Management Plans may be inspected at any of these sites.

Your school, <u>Kenai Central High School</u>, has been inspected for the presence of asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), and some building materials were found to contain asbestos. None of the identified ACBM poses a health hazard to occupants of the building when left undisturbed and properly managed in place. The Borough Maintenance Department regularly inspects and monitors the condition of all identified ACBM in the facility.

In the past twelve months, the following AHERA- related actions have taken place regarding this facility:

- Annual updates of AHERA Management Plan records;
- Asbestos awareness refresher training provided for school staff, custodians and maintenance workers (required once each school year);
- On-going communication of the presence of ACBM to visiting contractors and utility workers (required at the start of each site visit);
- Use of operations and maintenance practices by school staff, custodians and maintenance workers to avoid or minimize disturbance of ACBM;
- Every 6 months, a periodic inspection of all known ACBM;
- Removal of the following ACBM by certified asbestos abatement workers:

11/2/23 Removed Thermal System Insulation intact by cutting pipe fittings out during boy's bathroom remodel on room 26b from plumbing chase shared with cafeteria wall. 6/4/24 Boilers were removed from the building intact and set outside for the abatement of the asbestos gasket before being hauled to the scrap yard. 6/8/24 removal of 4,600 sq. ft. of Vinyl Asbestos Tile and asbestos backed sheet vinyl flooring and mastic from rooms 12a, b,15a, b, c, d, 16d, 2c, 28c, and 28d. Removal by aggressive methods using grinder with attached shroud, attached to HEPA vacuum.
