Upcoming Events

MAPS TESTING

KCHS 9th and 10th graders will be taking a MAP® Growth™ test from NWEA®. MAPGrowth scores help teachers check student performance by measuring achievement and growth.

The testing window for our school is December 17th-January 17th.

Teachers use results to tailor classroom lessons and set goals for students. MAP Growth tests are unique and adapt to your child's responses to measure your child's knowledge. If your child answers a question correctly, the next question is more challenging. If they answer incorrectly, the next one is easier. These results will provide a more complete picture of where your child is on their learning journey—regardless of whether they are on, above, or below their grade level.

Each school year, students in grades 9th and 10th take the tests in the fall, winter and spring. Following each testing period, you will receive a Family Report showing a summary of how your child is performing academically.

If a parent wishes to Opt-Out of Testing they will need to fill out the digital Opt-Out form in their PowerSchool Portal. Paper forms will no longer be valid.



Courselor Corner

The 2025-26 FAFSA is scheduled to be open and available for students and parents December 1, 2024. The FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA is free and gives students access to the largest source of student aid. Aid is available through the federal government in the form of grants, work-study funds, and loans. Students must complete the FAFSA to be eligible for the funds. According to the Federal Student Aid website: "The eligibility for federal student aid is based on financial need and on several other factors such as U.S. citizenship, enrollment in an eligible program, satisfactory academic progress in college, and more. There is no such thing as an income cut-off for federal aid. Eligibility is based on a number of factors. No student should assume that they won't qualify for federal aid. Filling out the FAFSA is the only way to truly find out. Additionally, the FAFSA is also an application for state and school aid as well. Many schools won't consider a student for their aid (even merit based) unless the student submits a FAFSA form."

Below I have included information directly from the Federal Student Aid site. The 2025-26 FAFSA Preview Presentation takes you screen by screen through the entire FAFSA. I have included this as google slides and PDF versions. An area students and parents can find complicated is who is considered a "parent" or "contributor" to the student. The link at the bottom walks you through determining who will be the contributor on a student's FAFSA form.

Who counts as a parent on the FAFSA form?

The above information helps students and parents determine who should fill out the parent contributor portion of the FAFSA.


A Windows-based desktop/laptop PC and the desktop version of Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint are required.
