


# First Quarter Newsletter

# **BUS INFORMATION**



First Student, KPBSD bus contractor, has the following rules: Students who are at a bus stop in the morning are allowed on the bus. If a student rode a bus to school in the morning,

they are allowed to ride that bus home in the afternoon. Any student that was not on the bus in the morning and wishes to ride the bus in the afternoon, will need to have a permission note or phone call from their parent or guardian. Please include the bus number, bus stop. street name, contact name and phone number. The note or phone call must come to the office in the morning or at lunchtime. Please do not wait until dismissal. Parental permission is required for students to ride a different bus in the afternoon or to be let off at a different bus stop.

Once the 'as needed' bus pass is made and turned in to the bus driver, the student can ride the bus for the rest of the school year. If you have any questions regarding these guidelines, please contact Kenai Middle School at 283-1700. Thank you.

# A MESSAGE FROM OUR NURSE

Each year the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District (KPBSD) addresses student health and wellness with a comprehensive approach that includes health screenings. The purpose of these school screenings is to detect any health concerns that might interfere with a child's education. If a child has poor, uncorrected vision or hearing, it makes it harder for him/her to succeed in school, sports, social situations, and in life. In addition, children with unhealthy growth patterns are at an increased risk for a variety of health problems and poor academic achievement.

Vision and hearing screenings are required, and growth screenings are recommended by the Alaska Division of Public Health. Results are confidential. Once completed, parents are notified of any concerns. Parents are also welcome to contact the school nurse for results. Parents/Guardians who do not wish to have their students screened for height and weight are able to complete an opt-out form, available in the KPBSD student handbook. Please contact the school nurse if you need resources for health concerns.

SUBJECT: AHERA School Management Plans

As mandated by Federal Regulation 40 CFR PART 763, known as AHERA (the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act, enacted in 1987), local educational agencies must notify parents/guardians/students in writing each school year about the existence and location of AHERA School Management Plans for each school building within their jurisdiction.

Currently, copies of all AHERA School Management Plans are located at the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's Central Office and at the Kenai Peninsula Borough Maintenance Office. Each school's administrative office also maintains a copy of the individual AHERA Management Plan for that school. AHERA Management Plans may be inspected at any of these sites.

Your school, <u>Kenai Middle School</u>, has been inspected for the presence of asbestos-containing building materials (ACBM), and some building materials were found to contain asbestos. None of the identified ACBM poses a health hazard to occupants of the building when left undisturbed and properly managed in place. The Borough Maintenance Department regularly inspects and monitors the condition of all identified ACBM in the facility.

In the past twelve months, the following AHERA- related actions have taken place regarding this facility:

- 1. Annual updates of AHERA Management Plan records;
- Asbestos awareness refresher training provided for school staff, custodians and maintenance workers (required once each school year);
- On-going communication of the presence of ACBM to visiting contractors and utility workers (required at the start of each site visit);
- Use of operations and maintenance practices by school staff, custodians and maintenance workers to avoid or minimize disturbance of ACBM:
- 5. Every 6 months, a periodic inspection of all known ACBM;
- Removal of the following ACBM by certified asbestos abatement workers:
   No asbestos removal activities were conducted at this school in the last 12 months
