While we all hoped and planned for a school year that included the waning effects of the Covid19 Pandemic, when we opened our doors we were met with quite a different reality. Thank you for:

- Following Symptoms Free Protocol and keeping your students home when they are sick.
- Following the Close Contact Protocol when your student has been identified as such.
- Understanding that Mountain View Elementary follows <u>The KPBSD Covid19 Mitigation Plan</u> and graciously accepting the request to come pick up your student from school when necessary for the above reasons.
- Getting your child tested when they show symptoms or are identified as a close contact.

We feel it is best to be open and transparent and so we do send school-wide notifications each day when positive cases are identified. This information is also updated daily on the KPBSD COVID 19 HUB> Risk Levels Link.

We have had extensive absences due to strict adherence to symptoms free and close contact protocols. On average last week, we had over 100 students absent each day. We foresee this trend continuing. With that statistic in mind, and considering the realities of last year's situation, our teachers are not marching through curriculum maps at a normal pace. We are focusing on Priority Standards and ensuring students grasp the basic competencies required at each grade level. We are assessing all students (absences have slowed this process as well) and designing our grade level schedules to ensure we can have interventions in place to meet the needs of all students. In short, it's not business as usual but business as necessary.

Please contact your child's teacher if you would like work for your student to do while they are absent. We have a packet pick up system outside and some classes have students trained to access on-line programs as well.

One thing we can be sure of is that things will change, hopefully for the better in the not too distant future. No matter the change, at that point things will change here too. We have an amazing staff here at Mountain View Elementary that continue to show the flexibility necessary to do what it takes to maintain the relationships and deliver the curriculum necessary to meet our student's needs.
