Social-Emotional Well Being


Our school culture has always focused on helping students develop the social and emotional capacities to function at their peak, in order to take full advantage of the educational opportunities our staff provides. With the additional stressors of COVID-19 coming at our students from all aspects of their life, this focus is as critical as ever. Now that we have completed our beginning of the year Positive Responses to Conflict lessons, we are moving on to teaching **the MindUp Curriculum.**

The beginning lessons in the MindUp Curriculum focus on helping students understand the parts of the brain and deepen their understanding of their own mental processes. Students are fascinated by the fact that their brain is made up of different parts with different functions. Other early lessons help students understand more about the processes of feeling, thinking, and learning. The combination of these two groups of lessons helps students to be aware of, and regulate their behavior, calm themselves in the face of anxiety, focus their attention, and take control of their learning.

Later MindUp lessons are dedicated **to helping students develop a positive mindset** and include lessons on perspective taking, choosing optimism, and appreciating happy experiences. The final lessons **focus on gratitude and kindness.**

These efforts to positively solve conflicts and tend to the social and emotional wellbeing of our students and staff are indeed the "other half of the equation" that makes Mountain View a great place to learn.
