Please take the time to read the embedded letter (pages 6-7) regarding COVID-19 and our response should there be a positive case, outbreak, or exposure to COVID-19 at the High School. This is particularly salient considering the impact of the recent cases at Seward Elementary. Do especially model and reinforce our Health Mandates. The longer we keep COVID out of our school, the longer we can keep it open and continue to create opportunities for our students.

The end of the quarter is Friday, October 16th. This means that the last day for students, before the end of the quarter, is Thursday, October 15th.

Parent/Teacher Conferences will look a little different, this year. Specifically, Mr. Scrivo will send out Sign-Up Genius reminders that will allow you to conduct Parent/Teacher Conferences in 15-minute increments. You will have a choice to come in for Conferences or meet remotely if you are not comfortable coming into the building. We will require all parents and visitors to follow our COVID-19 Mitigation Plan—use hand sanitizer, maintain 6' distancing, wear a mask when distancing is not possible. In addition, drop-in Conferences will not be possible. We ask that if you chose to come in-person that you only do it during your scheduled Conference time. If the Seward area goes into the High Risk (Red) Category, then Conferences will all be conducted remotely. We are planning to run a marathon session on Thursday, October 29th to create an evening session. Please be looking out for the P/T Conference sign-up link. Of course, this means that there will be no school for students.

The District requires that schools host at least two (2) ALICE Drills per year. As you might remember, ALICE stands for Alert, Lock-Down, Inform, Counter, and Evacuate and is used in response to an active threat on campus. Seward High is planning to run a Tabletop exercise on Thursday, October 8th at 9:05 AM. The Tabletop exercise is hypothetical. I will use the P/A System to create a variety of scenarios of potential threats that are specific to the layout of our building. Teachers will engage students in a discussion about how they might use the ALICE Protocols to respond to the information I provide. The protocols are fluid. Teacher and students' use of them will differ in relation to the nature and location of the hypothetical threat.

Living in a Pandemic Every Day



The school district policy of symptom-free protocol has been a tough one for everyone. The School Nurses have historically kept kids at school with a runny nose, headache, stomachache, sore throat, cough, etc.

I have been the school nurse for eleven years now and my practice has dramatically changed due to Covid-19. I am sending kids home with one or more of those symptoms. Staff have been affected by this as well because they have to go home too if they have one or more symptoms that can be Covid-19 related. I spend 99-100% of my time dealing with Covid-19. It reminds me of the movie Ground Hog Day with Bill Murray. When is the end game? I stole this from a recent article that I read written by a musher and this is what he said.

"Planning for forever is essentially impossible, which can actually be freeing: It brings you back into the present. How long will this pandemic last? Right now, that's irrelevant; what matters is eating a nourishing meal, telling someone you love them, walking your dog, getting enough sleep. What matters is that, to the degree you can, you make your own life sustainable every day."

What sustains me? My family, my bubble friends, hiking with my dogs, and reaffirming that Covid-19 does not define me.

Symptom Free School Protocol

dents, Staff, Volunteers, and Visitors:

t are experiencing one or more of these symptoms* stay home, and do not school or report to work:

- Temperature of 100 or greater
- Cough or Sore Throat
- Shortness of Breath
- Chills, Muscle Pain
- Runny or Stuffy Nose
- Headache, Vomiting, Diarrhea, Nausea, or Abdominal Pain
- New Loss of Taste or Smell
- New undiagnosed or untreated rash or skin condition
- · You are taking first 24 hours of antibiotic treatment















ALL COVID-19 TESTS MUST BE PCR OR MOLECULAR TESTS
ANTIGEN OR ANTIBODY TESTS WILL NOT FULFILL THE TESTING REQUIREMENT

When to Return to School after Illness:

- If you have been tested and are diagnosed with COVID19, you may return to school no sooner than 10 days after the onset of symptoms, or the date you took the test that was returned positive, whichever is earlier, and you have been symptom free for 24 hours without medication.
- If you have COVID19-like symptoms but choose not to be tested, you may return to school no sooner than 10 days after the onset of symptoms AND you must be fever-free for 24 hours without taking any medicine to reduce the fever AND you must be free of cough, cold, or other symptoms for 24 hours, without taking medication to reduce symptoms.
- If you have COVID19-like symptoms, are tested and receive a negative test result, you may provide the test results and return to school no sooner than 24 hours after you are symptom free without medication.

*Exceptions for preexisting conditions will be determined and potentially approved by the school nurse or administrator

Dear Seward High Parents, Guardians, and Larger Learning Community,

This letter will help your family prepare should our school district or your school have a <u>COVID-19 event</u> occur. An event could be a positive COVID-19 case, outbreak (two or more positive cases in a school) or exposure to COVID-19 in a school. The health and safety of our students, staff, and families is our top priority.

KPBSD works closely with local public health officials and they will provide support and direction to manage every COVID-19 related scenario that affects our school communities. If or when a COVID-19 event occurs related to your school, you will receive information via the usual school and district communication methods. Depending upon the situation and response needed by you, the contact may come via a phone call, email, alert, or general notification.

KPBSD honors <u>HIPAA and FERPA privacy laws</u>, so your name and your child's name will not be revealed by the school, unless you give the school permission to do so. A dedicated webpage at <u>KPBSD.org</u> is where to find the most up to date information.

If your child receives a positive COVID-19 test result, and they have been at school two days prior to the onset of symptoms, or the testing date that resulted in a positive test result, it will be helpful to begin contact tracing at their school immediately. So, we need your help when you learn of a positive COVID-19 test result for your child. Call Nurse Iris, KPBSD Nursing Supervisor to confidentially report a positive COVID-19 test result. It is important for everyone in our community to protect themselves against the remarkably contagious novel coronavirus. These are some ways to protect your family:

Symptom Free School Protocol: keep children who are sick at home—do not send them to school

Teach your children to wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds, and set a good example by doing this yourself

Teach children to cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or by coughing into the inside of their elbow, Be sure to set a good example by doing this yourself

Time and distance: teach your children to protect your family bubble or their school cohort, and practice physical distancing of about six feet away from others

Mask up with a cloth face covering when appropriate, especially indoors in crowded public places, on the school bus, and in school hallways. Grades 3 and older in the KPBSD wear a mask at school when six foot physical distancing is not possible

This year will require adaption, a flexible mindset, and we will get through this with both challenges and blessings. We promise to communicate often, be proactive and swiftly reactive when necessary, even when we do not have all the answers. Superintendent John O'Brien reminds us, "We will focus on and provide for the social, emotional, and mental health needs of our students, staff, parents, and community. I have no doubt that together we will not only get through this new school year but will also hopefully become more resilient and empathic to the needs of others."
