Welcome Back!

I have been providing Covid-19 testing for free for our staff and students. I have been averaging 2 tests a week. It will be interesting to see if this goes up with our schools welcoming back all students for in-person instruction. I request that you call me and make an appt. if your child needs to be tested for Covid-19. Just wanted to simply say it has been wonderful to see the students back in school. There was a published, nine-week study done in Fall of 2020 in North Carolina's school districts. The school districts had over 90,000 students in a high transmission rate in the communities. The schools practiced the mitigation plans of masking, social distancing, and handwashing. Out of 90,000 students, there were only 32 in school transmissions. There was no child to adult transmission. This is very good news for our community because we have been supporting the same mitigation plan of masking, social distancing and handwashing. Our local providers are also working hard to get us vaccinated. The urgency of getting vaccinated is made more apparent because of the virus mutating and supposedly more contagious then the original Covid-19 virus. Experts are saying that vaccination numbers need to be in the 70-85% for herd immunity and lessen the chances of the mutating virus to be passed on from person to person.


Grades: Final grades for Spring 2021 semester will be available to view at UA Online on May 6, 2021.
