Your application should be no more than the equivalent of 10 pages (one side only).

Submittal should include the following:

- 1. A resume or short summary of academic and extracurricular activities and accomplishments.
- 2. A copy of your common app essay [(or if you do not have a common app essay, a writing sample (not less than 400 words) on a topic that is important to you.)]
- 3. An essay (no more than 300 words) that describes how your life experience in Seward and your community there have influenced your life aspirations.
- 4. A letter (not more than 200 words) from a parent or guardian presenting any information that the parent wishes to share regarding your family's situation and need for financial assistance to enable you to continue in school. You may submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form as part of your response, if applicable.
- 5. Letters of recommendations (up to two) addressing your character, personality and accomplishments/community service. At least one should be from a school teacher/administrator.
- 6. Your official High School transcript. College Test scores (SAT and/or ACT) are not required, but may be submitted and may help the Kawabe Memorial Fund committee in evaluating your application.

For the school year beginning in Fall 2021, awards will be first-year scholarships only, and scholarships for subsequent years (renewal requests) will not be awarded in future years.

Beginning with the Fall 2021 school year, the Kawabe Memorial Fund welcomes applications for a limited number of awards to students intending to continue their post-high school education at Alaska vocational technical schools. For applications by these students, please submit the materials described above but for item 2 (a common app essay [or writing sample]) please instead describe, in no more than 200 words, your intended course of study and why you have chosen it.
