Notes from the principal:

I recognize that the Seward City Council lifted the mask mandate, but wanted all of you to know that the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District's mask, distancing, symptom-free, and sanitation mandates remain in place. I feel very fortunate that (so far) we've been able to keep COVID out of our schools. I must attribute this to our Health Mandates and the consistent enforcement of them by the entire Seward High Staff. I greatly appreciate your patience and support through our efforts to balance a positive educational experience with our mandate to keep our students and staff safe.

As you know, spring is also budget season for the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District. To that end, KPBSD will hold their annual regional budget meeting on Thursday, March 18th in a hybrid format. You'll have access to a Zoom link to participate remotely, or you can join a live session in the Seward High Theater at 6:00 PM. Live participants will be required to follow the District's Health Mandates. This is a particularly grim budget cycle as both the State and Borough are feeling the financial pinch created by the pandemic. This will be a double hit as Seward High's enrollment is also significantly down from our pre-COVID projections. Please educate yourselves and consider advocacy for great returns on the Borough and State's investment in Seward's schools.

These last weeks before Spring Break are critical to build momentum into the April test season and May's graduation. Please engage your child(ren) in a discussion regarding the importance of maintaining their efforts for success all the way into Spring Break—academically, behaviorally, and with attendance.

JumpStart Program (Discounted Tuition Program) Students are eligible for JumpStart once they have completed their Sophomore year, and can begin taking KPC courses the summer before their Junior standing in high school. Students can take up to six credits per semester for up to six semesters (up to 30 credits total).

*Please visit with Mr. Dye to determine what KPC classes will provide dual credit (meet both high school and college needs). *Meet with a KPC Advisor, Jackie Marshall to ensure your courses meet your long-term academic goals. Grades: Final grades for Spring 2021 semester will be available to view at UA Online on May 6, 2021.

Transcripts for the college classes taken at KPC will need to be ordered and sent to the post-secondary institution you plan to apply or attend. Transcripts must be ordered online via www.kpc.alaska.edu click on UAOnline and log in to secured area using UA Username and UA Password. **Please note-**It is the student's responsibility to review their unofficial transcript for accuracy prior to submitting the online request for an official transcript.



Dan Marshall for all of his hard work & dedication to this last production, and ALL the other 30+ productions he has produced and directed over the last 29 years.

West of Pecos was special for many reasons. "We did West of Pecos in the mid 1990's, and Jenny Blackwell payed the roll of Passenger #2. I was able to recast her in our most recent rendition this last January, and 25 years later, Jen Ransom played Passenger #2 again. Kameron Kowalski, (another SHS drama alumna) stepped in as well to take the role of Passenger #1. We were so grateful that these two women were willing to take these roles, since I was unable to fill them with students." said Mr. Marshall. He also wants to extend a special thank you to Mr. Ronn Hemstock, saying. "This year, Ronn Hemstock served our production as the set builder, and lights man. He proved to be as good in the job as anyone I have ever worked with in that capacity."
