
All Hands on Deck

JumpStart Program (Discounted Tuition Program) Get a jump on college!!! Students are eligible for JumpStart once they have completed their Sophomore year, and can begin taking KPC courses the summer before their Junior standing in high school. <u>Students can take up to six credits per semester for up to six semesters (up to 30 credits total)</u>. \*Please visit with Mr. Dye to determine what KPC classes will provide dual credit (meet both high school and college needs). \*Meet with a KPC Advisor, Jackie Marshall to ensure your courses meet your long-term academic goals.




