2. **Scholarships.com**
Offers a large database of scholarships and allows students to filter opportunities by year, major, and demographics.
3. **Cappex**
Provides not only scholarships but also college reviews and a scholarship match feature based on personal profiles.
4. **College Board Scholarship Search**
Sponsored by the College Board, this site matches students with potential scholarships based on their interests and academic achievements.
5. **Niche**
Offers a variety of scholarship options, some of which don't require essays or long applications.
6. **Chegg Scholarships**
Allows students to search and apply for scholarships easily by creating a profile and receiving matches based on their eligibility.
7. **Peterson's**
Provides access to scholarship listings, as well as college planning and financial aid resources.
8. **Unigo**

- CollegeBoard imposes the following fees: Change test center fee, \$29; Cancellation fee, \$29; Late cancellation fee, \$39; Late registration fee, \$34. Also, students may be eligible for a fee waiver for test registration.
- Registration fees (excluding Saturday SAT tests) are payable to Ms. Price before the registration deadline.

The SAT test is a standardized test widely used for college admissions and scholarships (including the Alaska Performance Scholarship). Juniors, and especially Seniors, should seriously consider taking the SAT test.

The PSAT/NMSQT assessment (Practice SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) is for 10th and 11th grade students. For 10th grade students, the assessment is basically a practice SAT test. For 11th grade students, the score is used to possibly qualify for the National Merit Scholarship.

The ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery) is a timed, multi-aptitude assessment with subtests in Verbal, Math, and Science/Technical. Students, 10th grade and above, interested in careers in the military should consider taking this assessment.
