



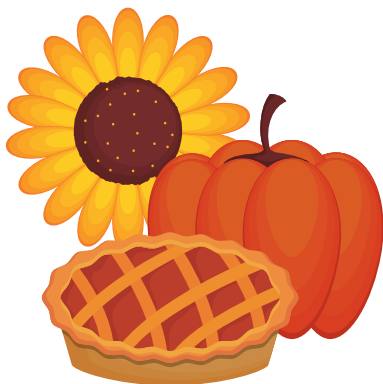

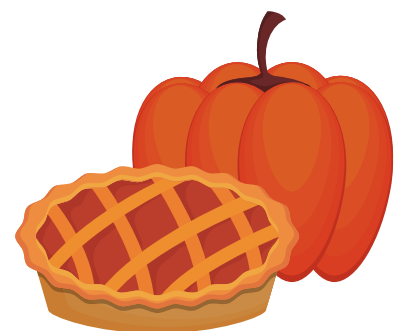

❖ Attention high school seniors and parents/guardians! Mark your calendars for the Financial Aid Night on December 5. The event will run from 5pm – 6pm in the high school library. Parents and students of all grade levels who are interested in learning about the **financial aid process for all post-secondary programs are welcome.** Information regarding Free Application for Federal Student Aid – FAFSA, Scholarships, Loans & Grants & College Financial Aid Planning.

❖ **JumpStart Program - Get a Jump on college or complete high school graduation requirements through the dual enrollment JumpStart Program (Discounted Tuition Program)** Students are eligible for JumpStart once they have completed their sophomore year and can begin taking KPC courses the summer before their Junior standing in high school. Students can take up to six credits per semester for up to six semesters (up to 30 credits total). *Please visit with Mr. Dye to determine what KPC classes will provide dual credit (meet both high school and college needs). *Meet with a KPC Advisor, Jackie Marshall to ensure your courses meet your long-term academic goals.

❖ The KPC Spring 2025 schedule is viewable online [HERE](#) There is a broad offering of online classes both synchronous and asynchronous

❖ Two classes will be taught by KPC Adjunct Faculty Dan Marshall: An in-person English A121 -Introduction to Literature class meets Mondays beginning January 13. There are no prerequisites or English placement test/scores required for this course. An asynchronous (online/no meeting time) WRTG A111 - Writing Across Contexts. There are prerequisites for this course. Completion of WRTG A110 or placement with designated scores in the Accuplacer, SAT/ACT or UAA Writing Sample.

Online Registration for Spring 2025 semester opens November 11th for high school students.

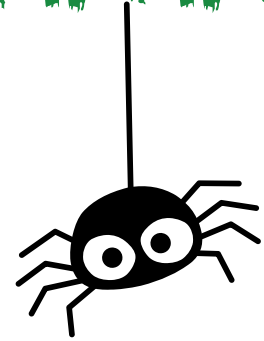
1. **Fastweb**

Congratulations to all the students at SHS who made it onto the Honor Roll! Over **80** students is an impressive achievement. It's wonderful to see their hard work and dedication.

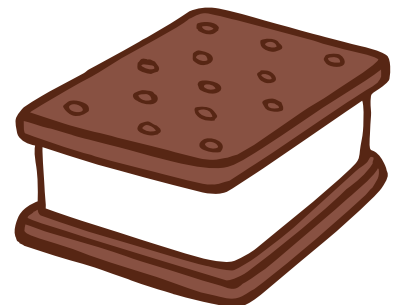
To celebrate, students were awarded certificates and enjoyed ice cream as a way to say congratulations for their efforts.

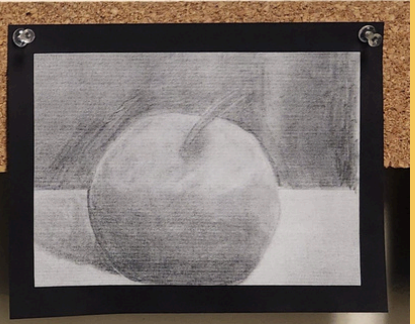
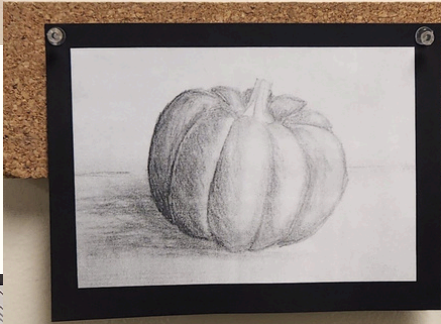

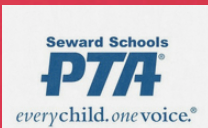
