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Old Business:

Late work Policy BP 5121

Assessment should be based on impartial, consistent observation of the quality of the student's work and his/her mastery of course content and objectives as demonstrated through classroom participation, homework and tests. The student's behavior and effort shall be reported in separate evaluations, not in his/her academic grade.

<u>Departments</u> worked together to design a department policy in response to the late work challenges

Schoolwide Late Work Policy

Our goal is to educate students and provide them with opportunities to grow academically while increasing personal responsibility. Research shows that when teachers place emphasis on the learning process and provide a supportive environment, students are more likely to be engaged. In some circumstances, such as math, it is important that students stay caught up as the information builds upon prior knowledge. The structure of other classes allows more flexibility to accept late assignments.

In all subject areas,

- Please provide grace to your students during extenuating circumstances.
- Three or more late assignments in your class= parent communication. Try to get to the root of the problem. Is there something going on that we don't know about? Many times, parents are unaware their child is not turning in work.
- If this pattern continues, please refer the student to I-team.


<u>Cell Phones</u> –Cell phones may be used to make or receive calls before the first bell rings in the morning, at lunch, or after school is dismissed in the afternoon. Any additional violations will require that the phone be picked up by the parent or guardian and may result in additional disciplinary actions.



The fruit we can see (or want to see):


High performing academic school, strong Panther culture, involved parents and strong community relationships, students and staff LOVE being a part of our school and they frequently share their positive experiences.
