



## Title I Parent, Family and School Expectations

KPBSD (BP6020) recognizes that continued parental involvement in the education of children contributes greatly to student achievement and conduct. ### As a teacher, I will:

- Provide high-quality, evidenced based curriculum and instruction,
- Strive to motivate my students to learn,
- Have high expectations and help every child to succeed in learning.
- Communicate regularly with families about student progress,
- Provide a safe and caring learning environment,
- Actively participate in collaborative decision helping students achieve high academic standards,
- Promote meaningful support through partnerships with families,
- Respect the school, students, staff and families.

### As member of the family, I will:

- Provide a quiet time and place for homework; monitor TV/computer/device time,
- Read to my child, or encourage my child to read every day 20-30 minutes
- Communicate with the teacher or the administrator when I have a concern,
- Ensure that my child attends school every day and gets adequate sleep,
- Regularly monitor my child's progress in school,
- Participate in school decision-making activities; attend parent/teacher conferences,
- Communicate the importance of education and learning to my child,
- Respect the school, staff, students, and families.

### As a student, I will:

- Come to school ready to learn and work hard,
- Bring my completed homework and assignments,
- Know and follow the school and class rules,
- Ask for help when I need it,
- Talk to my parents and teachers about school experiences so that they can help me to be successful in school,
- Study or read every day after school. Limit TV/computer/device and game time.
- Respect the school, classmates, staff and families.
