#### ❖ BOY Data:

MAPS, mClass, iReady, and State Assessment data were all presented and discussed. As a school, in nationally normed assessments, we are overall slightly below national averages. The difference between criterion and norm referenced data was also discussed to get a better understanding of the data covered.

#### Path to the Park:

The path to the park continues to be an interesting journey. The current path does not address the student safety issue of getting students to and from the park. It actually deters from it with students wanting to climb on the blocks. Concerns of snow removal have also been voiced, which will need to be addressed. There is continued discussion about using a culvert to make the original path usable again.

With a new health curriculum, Erin's Law, Bree's Law, and a new electronic opt out form there was plenty of concern regarding all the health initiatives, which were addressed. Some parents inadvertently checked the box that takes their child out of all health lessons, which was not their intent. With the box checked, and the specific sexual language in parenthesis adjacent to the box, those students will only receive non-sexual related health lessons.
