Basic human development and behavioral characteristics of individuals form the basic needs, development of psychological and physiological needs. Students will examine basic needs, development of interpersonal skills, behavior modification, and use of assertiveness, elimination of stereotyping, dealing with stress, conflict, and abuse, and practicing problem-solving techniques. Personal relationships allow the students to obtain self-knowledge and to practice the skills necessary for a successful and responsible life. The emphasis is for each person to grow and achieve his or her full potential, by developing their future employability skills. Preliminary career investigation relative to personal characteristics, wants, and goals is appropriate in this course.
