Kim Reiersen has been serving as the Seward High School Athletic Booster Club president for the past eleven years. “The booster club averages approximately \$ 30,000 in fundraising efforts every year, and in her time as president, Ms. Reiersen has overseen the distribution of about \$ 330,000 that directly benefits Seward High School athletic programs,” said Trevan Walker, Seward High principal. “These benefits include a regular uniform purchase rotation, assistance with state travel expenses, hotel rooms for regional events, equipment replacement, and so forth.”

In addition, Ms. Reiersen oversaw the creation and continued growth of the Seward High Booster Club’s Endowment Fund through the Seward Community Foundation. The endowment operates as the Seward High Booster Club’s personal permanent fund. The goal for the endowment is that the interest and dividend income will eventually cover all of the Booster Club’s expenditures. Seward High’s athletes will benefit from Ms. Reiersen’s tenure as Booster Club president into perpetuity.

Most telling about Ms. Reiersen’s commitment to Seward High athletics is that her youngest child graduated from Seward High in 2009. She has remained Booster Club president for no other reason than her love of Seward High athletics and her dedication to the students.
