Safety Precaution Reminder: Parental supervision requested for children at bus stops, and while walking and biking to and from school.

ENERGY WATCH CONSERVATION TEST SET FOR WED., OCT. 19, 6-8 P.M. Southcentral residents asked to scale back energy use for two hours

ANCHORAGE-KENAI-MAT-SU- Southcentral Alaska residents are being asked to voluntarily reduce their energy consumption for two hours on the evening of Wed., Oct. 19.

The test is being coordinated by the Municipality of Anchorage, with cooperation from Chugach Electric Association, Municipal Light & Power, Matanuska Electric Association, Homer Electric Association, ENSTAR, and the Matanuska-Susitna and Kenai Peninsula Boroughs. The entities have worked together this fall on Energy Watch, a campaign designed to call attention to the possibility of a natural gas delivery problem.

Residents of the Mat-Su Borough, the Municipality of Anchorage and the Kenai Peninsula Borough are being asked to participate in the voluntary test.

Between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. on Oct. 19, residents are being asked to reduce their energy consumption to the yellow level of the Energy Watch chart (attached). The steps include lowering the thermostat to 65 degrees; shutting off unnecessary lights and electronics; setting the water heater to "warm" or "vacation"; postponing washing dishes and doing laundry; and reducing natural gas range use.

Commercial customers have been encouraged to develop their own two-step plans to mirror the suggestions at the "yellow" and "red" stages of the Energy Watch chart. The two-hour exercise window provides an opportunity for them to implement the first stage of their individual reductions.

The goal of the conservation test is to see what kind of effect voluntary actions might have on overall energy consumption. In the event of a real energy deliverability problem, one of the first steps will be to ask residents to take voluntary steps similar to ones being proposed for the Oct. 19 test.

The utilities and agencies involved in the Energy Watch campaign have continually stressed that a natural gas delivery problem this winter is not likely. However, in case it does happen, it is prudent to have a plan in place.

<u>Note to media:</u> Results of the test will be available on Mon., Oct. 24, via press release after the utilities have conducted data analysis. In addition, results from a scientific poll asking residents in Anchorage, Mat-Su and the Kenai Peninsula about their awareness of and participation in the test will be available.

Spring Creek School to close June 30, 2012

Soldotna, October 20, 2011— The Youthful Offender Program (YOP), currently located in Seward, Alaska, will move from the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District to the Anchorage School District June 30, 2012.

Spring Creek School is part of the Youthful Offender Program (YOP) located in Spring Creek Correctional Center—a maximum security state operated correctional facility in Seward, Alaska. The Alaska Department of Corrections determined the YOP can be better served at the Anchorage Correctional Complex, a multi-custody correctional facility with several dorms in an array of sizes.

Alaska Department of Corrections Commissioner Joe Schmidt explained, "The Youthful Offender Program is moving because of a bed issue." Thus the variety of dorm sizes available at the Anchorage Correctional Complex will be able to better serve the Youthful Offender Program.

KPBSD began the educational programming at Spring Creek School in the fall of 2000. Dr. Steve Atwater, KPBSD superintendent said:

"We're very sorry to see the program leave the district, however we understand the reason why, and we will work closely with Anchorage School District."

Spring Creek School and high school graduation will proceed as usual for the 2011-2012 school year. KPBSD staff has been advised of the June 30 closure. We are offering to help the Anchorage School District with the transition.

About the Youthful Offender Program: This is an intensive program of rehabilitation for incarcerated youth up to 22 years of age. The program includes ongoing needs assessment, treatment planning, daily support, **high school education programming operated by the Kenai Peninsula Borough School District,** counseling and structured living. This program is available to pretrial and convicted youthful offenders.

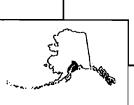
The attached ordinance appropriates \$663,000 for the repair/replacement of the Homer High School track. The Homer High School track is in need of major repair/replacement and was recently closed as it was considered unsafe for use. The cost of repairing/replacing the track is estimated at between \$750,000 and \$1,100,000.

This project is included in the school district's list of capital improvement projects that was recently submitted to the Department of Education. In addition, the borough administration has requested Governor Parnell include funding for this project in his proposed FY2013 budget.

The administration is recommending the \$663,000 the school district returned to the borough in FY2011 to comply with State of Alaska requirements regarding fund balance limits be appropriated to provide partial funding for this project.

The administration would also like to work with the school district to review how capital improvement projects are identified and funded.

Re: Homer High Track Replacement

Greetings,

It has come to our attention that an ordinance will be put forward to fund the replacement of the Homer High School track through a direct appropriation from the Borough. We have been informally asked to comment on such an action. At its regular meeting on October 17, the Board of Education informally discussed this subject and then adopted a motion which asked me to write this letter.

While we all recognize the urgency of the replacement of the track in Homer, many questions are raised by such an action, and we would like to pursue some of those questions before the Borough takes such a step. Currently, there exists a process by which the decisions are made relative to which, and in what order, maintenance projects are completed. While we are generally confused about how that actually happens, we have been led to believe that such a process exists. Departing from that process is a step which we believe should be done thoughtfully and carefully.

We would like to propose/request the establishment of a working group which would consist of 3 members of each of our organizations, along with a couple of interested public citizens and the director of maintenance from both the Borough and the School District. This group would thoroughly review how capital projects are funded and completed under the current system, and then potentially make suggestions for more efficient/transparent methods to utilize in the future.

We can all be proud of the way this Borough and School District have maintained our facilities in the past. However, it is clear that some aspects of that maintenance have been overlooked/not funded. We believe that a transparent process which involves both of our respective organizations is a good first step in identifying if there are problems. We do not believe that School District maintenance projects should become part of a political process which is open to the vagaries of public pressure.

In summary, we would prefer that you consider establishing this working group prior to taking action on any direct appropriation of Borough funds for a capital project. As always, I am available to discuss this issue if you would like.

Ordinance 2011- 4: Providing for the Apportionment and Composition of Borough

Assembly and Board of Education Seats

In the October 4, 2011 Regular Municipal Election, the Kenai Peninsula Borough voters considered Proposition No. 3, providing for the apportionment of the Assembly and the Board of Education.

Alaska Statute 29.20.070(d) and KPB 22.30.020(C) both require that within 30 days after certification of election results the assembly adopt an ordinance providing for composition of the assembly, the form of assembly representation that received the most votes, and, if applicable, the apportionment of assembly seats in accordance with the form of representation that received the most votes. Hearing on shortened time is requested in order that this may be heard within thirty days as required by Alaska Statute.

District lines will need to be revised in order to comply with the equal representation standards of the United States and Alaska Constitutions. However, the State has not yet issued final precinct lines. Until those lines are issued, the Clerk's office and GIS cannot draw assembly district lines that coincide as nearly as possible to the State precinct lines. Accordingly, pursuant to this ordinance, a committee of no more than three Assembly members and the Borough Clerk, with support from the administration, shall submit proposed district boundary lines for approval by ordinance within one month of the State's publication of election precinct boundaries or by the first assembly meeting in April 2012, whichever occurs first. This is to provide time for adoption of the revised boundaries before the borough must submit the plan to the Department of Justice for approval and the election filing period in August 2012.

At that time, the determination will be reached as to whether assembly members' terms of office shall be truncated due to deviations from the existing districts.
