Board of Education Meeting News In Brief

WORKSESSION REPORT: The Board held several worksessions prior to the formal business meeting which included technology, special education and curriculum. The Board held a conference call with legislators to discuss education legislation.

AWARDS AND PRESENTATIONS: The Board presented a Golden Apple Award to Mrs. Lana Syverson for her service to the students at Soldotna High School.

SCHOOL REPORT: Mr. Vaughn Dosko, Kenai Middle School, introduced Mrs. Margaret Gilman, teacher, and Mr. Dan Beck, assistant principal. Alternatingly, they gave a Powerpoint presentation highlighting student enrollment, international students, transition and orientation assistance from elementary school into the middle school, parent orientation and open house, Welcoming All Kids (WAK) orientation, and the visually impaired program. Mrs. Jordana Engebretsen, visually impaired teacher, introduced Ms. Peggy Jones, Mr. John Clare, and Miss Maria Maes, student. She stated that only two students in the district can read Braille. She demonstrated the Job Access With Speech (JAWS) screen reading software. Miss Maes concluded the presentation by singing *Welcome Home*.

Mr. Loren Reese, Kenai Alternative School principal, gave a Powerpoint presentation highlighting the admission process, student demographics, academic schedule, Healthy Choices/Healthy Changes grant activities, the community supported breakfast program, Thanksgiving Day Feast, community mentoring program, educational moose hunt, student recognition programs, preschool program and graduation history. Mr. Eddie Snyder, Miss Tatiana Edelben, and Miss Janae Brooks testified in support of the Kenai Alternative High School.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Dr. Atwater asked for a Board worksession during the week of April 16 to review the proposed draft of the District's mission statement and vision statement. He announced that standards-based assessments begin April 3 and noted that student test results will be tied to the primary teacher. He reported that a meeting will be held on April 3 to discuss the school facility situation at Kachemak Selo. He reported that Soldotna area principals met to explore ways to reconfigure Soldotna schools and noted that Soldotna Middle School may add sixth grade. He stated that he will bring a recommendation to the Board at the May meeting regarding transportation. He thanked those that have testified before state legislators, and Mr. Jones and Mrs. Crawford for their work with legislators. He expressed condolences to the family of a Nikiski student who was recently killed in a car accident.

FINANCIAL REPORT: Mr. Jones presented District financial reports for the period ending February 29, 2012.

POLICY MANUAL REVISIONS: The Board unanimously approved revisions to AR 5144.1, Suspension and Expulsion and AR 5144.11, Due Process.

CHANGE IN CONFIGURATION OF TITLE I SCHOOLS: The Board unanimously approved changes in school configuration for Kenai Alternative, Nikolaevsk School, Port Graham School and Razdolna School, which will allow them to offer pre-kindergarten for special education students.

FY13 BUDGET: The Board unanimously approved a General Fund FY13 Budget of \$143,007,644, with budgeted revenue from all sources of \$140,526,201 and use of fund balance of \$2,481,143.

POLICY MANUAL REVISIONS: The Board unanimously approved revisions to BP 0210, Vision for Student Learning.

FY12 BUDGET REVISION: The Board unanimously approved a revision to the F12 General Fund revenue budget of \$139,930,278, plus the \$316,822 increase in state revenue, less the decreased use of fund balance for a total revised FY12 Revenue budget of \$138,913,091.

SUPPORT BOROUGH ORDINANCE 2012-08: The Board unanimously approved a recommendation to Support Borough Ordinance 2012-08, An Ordinance Amending The Borough Code To Revise Assembly And School Board District Boundaries And Providing For Truncation Of The Term For Assembly Seat Number 2.
