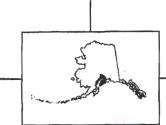

# Kenai Peninsula Borough School District Board of Education Meeting News In Brief

June 3, 2013 - 7:00 p.m.Borough Administration Building - 148 N. BinkleyDr. Steve Atwater, SuperintendentSoldotna, Alaska

**WORKSESSION REPORT:** The Board held several worksessions prior to the formal business) meeting which included Board policy, an FY14 budget update, the teacher evaluation system, Soldotna area schools grades 7-9, and proposed KPSAA handbook revisions.

**HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:** Dr. Sylvia Reynolds gave a presentation regarding the Liberian Book Project, a program that provided transportation and funds to ship a supply of outdated Kenai Peninsula Borough School District textbooks (Triumphs and Treasures curriculum) to students in Liberia. She shared a PowerPoint presentation of photos from the project that included some of the schools and students visited. She presented the Board and District with a handmade, wooden plaque from these schools in Ganta Nimba County, Liberia.

**SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:** Dr. Atwater reported that, although the economy on the Peninsula is improving, student enrollment at the end of the 2012-2013 school is the lowest in over 20 years. He stated that he met with Borough Mayor Navarre to discuss funding options for needed capital projects (including remaining roofing projects), that the Borough plan to propose a bond to the public in October for approximately \$25 million, and noted that a related worksession and action item will be included in the Board's July regular meeting agenda. He discussed this year's summer school programs (which started today, June 3), and include an Extended School Year (ESY) for students with Individual Education Plans (IEP's), and credit recovery classes which are also available to students online. He announced that internet bandwidth will be doubled at Homer Flex School, Susan B. English School, Sterling Elementary, and Paul Banks Elementary. He thanked Mr. Tim Peterson for his service to the District and wished him well in retirement.

**LEASE AGREEMENTS:** Mr. Jones reviewed the report of leases and agreements for the 2013-2014 school year.

**FINANCIAL REPORT:** Mr. Jones presented the financial report of the District for the period ending April 30, 2013

**SCHOOL REPORT:** Mrs. Norma Holmgaard, principal of Mountain View Elementary School, introduced Mrs. Renee Christensen, 5th grade teacher, who discussed the school's collaboration program and its effects on student learning. Mrs. Holmgaard discussed the priority of school climate, safety, and the school climate committee. She introduced Mr. Karl Kircher, Assistant Principal, and a group of students who (with the assistance of Board member, Mr. Dan Castimore) performed a school bus safety demonstration. Using bus behavior as an example, Mr. Kircher presented a PowerPoint presentation highlighting the school's climate; strategic plan; student responsibility; and behavior rules, expectations, and plan success. #### GOAL:

Investigate how the Lindsay Unified School District is implementing the performance based model and explore the feasibility of creating a partnership between our schools. If possible, then lay the foundation on which to build this partnership.

#### BACKGROUND:

Lindsay Unified School District has been working on implementing a performance based model for approximately five years. Currently, they are in the first years of a full scale implementation in grades K-12. Using Race to the Top Funds, Lindsay is currently beginning the work to create a base for the performance based model by using the Common Core Standards for ELA and Math and NextGen Standards for Science. Lindsay has also worked previously with Dr. Marzano on grading practices and utilizes many of David Langford's tools in their schools. Along with that, Lindsay is also a user of 3 Shapes Educate Software. Given all these factors, Lindsay has the potential to be a strong partner with RCA.

#### **COMMON CORE ELA:**

During our session with Joe Vagt, we discussed the current implementation of the ELA CC standards. Joe is working with a group to adapt the common core standards, write scoring guides, design assessments and write activities to meet these standards. Their greatest area of need currently is the Score 4 (Advanced) rubrics, activities or guides. They are looking to improve the use of "teaching others" as the advanced route. We discussed our use of quality rubrics in science and technology. These could also be adapted to create a variety of standard, level-band quality rubrics which must be met to achieve that Score 4. At the same time, we also discussed the creation of additional activities which require a more intense investigation of the standard, an application of the standard to another content area or a real world activity. Potential issues in the ELA standards currently are the split of the 9-10 and 11-12 grade levels. Teachers in Lindsay report that these are split based on the standard, with some standards being repeated in both levels and others being scaffolded according to difficulty.

#### COMMON CORE MATH:

Michelle Standlee is heading the math implementation for Common Core. Currently Lindsay is interested in designing a program which will meet the needs of the CC standards – traditional practice and practical application/understanding. In doing so, they are looking to improve their current program in math, which very closely resembles the different iterations of math that we have used at RCA over the years. The most challenging (and beneficial) part of this program will be to create more intricate and scaffolded skills in each standard. As in ELA, the current need is in the Score 4 activities. Traditionally, this is a strength of RCA. We routinely apply various math skills in science and technology activities.

#### **NEXT GEN SCIENCE:**

The work that KPBSD and RCA have undertaken this year is aligned with the direction where Lindsay is headed in science. They are currently in a holding pattern on the implementation of NEXT GEN due to restrictions at the state level. The future of this work lies in that Lindsay could benefit from the standards, scoring guides and activities that RCA has already created for half of the 7-12 science levels.

#### **MARZANO GRADING PRACTICES:**

In looking at the different grading practices, there are a few differences between Lindsay and RCA. Although some are superficial (Score 3 = Proficient), others represent a small shift in how we design curriculum and assessments. Lindsay relies more on the scaffolding of each standard in a progression of skills. This may be an area where RCA could improve our implementation of the model. This year we will use our Site Career Development Grant to work on the Marzano grading philosophy.

#### **EDUCATE & EMPOWER:**

Educate was often a topic of discussion in the different sessions. Tad and I were both very surprised to see that the use of Educate in Lindsay is more limited than at RCA. The reality is that the software needs a major update. During the session discussing Educate, we were able to preview the possible new features of Empower, which is the software being designed by Educate. The new upgrade would represent a significant shift into a stronger focus on pacing and progress with the standards and rubrics taking a less prominent role in the interface. The "engine" of Educate would remain the same, but the user interface would be an improvement. The uses that we have for Educate are similar to Lindsay's, as are the issues that we face. We also suggested a few additional features that would make Educate even more powerful as a tool for parents and students.

#### **PARTNERSHIP POTENTIAL:**

There is a strong willingness and alignment in partnering with Lindsay. As part of the Race to the Top Grant, they are to share the model. With the experience that RCA brings to the table, Lindsay has been very interested in working together. These are the places where Lindsay has asked us to contribute to the work. In doing so, we will gain the work which they have completed, which can be used at RCA.

- ELA & Math Score 4 Activities, including the quality rubrics for teaching others, and standard project types
- Next Gen Science standards, scoring guides and activities
- Educate/Empower Review and suggestions

#### NEXT STEPS:

We will continue our communication with Lindsay and begin writing sample Score 4 Activities. We have already shared a rough draft of our Science Standards and will do the same with activities. In the realm of Math, we have begun discussions and resource sharing for the variety of projects needed to achieve the balanced instructional model. As a staff, RCA will complete the Marzano training to increase our knowledge of his practices. As a team, we are also looking for additional ways to bring our staff to Lindsay to visit, meet and share in the work they have going.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The reconfiguration of the Soldotna area secondary schools raises a series of items that require a decision or response by the district administration. One of the larger items is the question of whether the district should continue to operate the swimming pool at what will be Skyview Middle School. The district has a practice of maintaining swimming pools at most of its high schools (Nikiski MSHS does not have a pool) and also at two K-12 schools (Susan B. English and Ninilchik). None of our middle schools have swimming pools.

The amount of use of the Skyview pool varies. In June of 2013 average participation was 109 with 42 of these swimmers using the pool for swim lessons. In October the average daily use of the pool was 31 swimmers.

The annual cost of maintaining the Skyview pool is about \$170,000. In addition, the pool is scheduled for periodic maintenance (filter overhaul) of \$80,000 that is due to occur this summer. Funds for this maintenance would be drawn from the Borough's Capital Maintenance Fund and will be used elsewhere in the event that this maintenance does not occur because the pool is not opened for FY15.

After considering our preliminary FY15 deficit, I recommend closing the Skyview pool for FY15. Further, I recommend that should additional revenues from the Borough and State be available, then this pool will be one of several expenditure reductions to be considered for reinstatement in our budget. You will consider this recommendation at the January worksession.

#### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In response to SB90, the Senate Finance Committee commissioned the Hay Group to conduct a study of the group health programs currently managed by the State's 53 school districts. The purpose of the study was threefold. One, to determine the cost of providing health care to the districts' employees. Two, to understand the cost and utilization associated with a health plan administered by a non-profit entity (a trust). Three, estimate the cost and overall impact of consolidating public school employees under a state managed group health insurance program.

There are about 16,000 public school employees. The state's districts spend \$264 million on health care for these employees. The average cost as a percentage of funding is 15.6%. Overall, school district employees pay about 11% of the total health care costs.

The report includes four options to be considered and recommends option three, centrally managed school district program with standard health plan options and cost sharing. In this option, employees would be offered a different menu of health plans than are available in the state's AlaskaCare. In addition, this option creates a uniform premium cost sharing strategy for school districts to follow. The potential savings for this option is between \$22.7 and \$33.7 million.

In October you set your 2014 legislative priorities that included exploring health care options for school districts and their employees. Further, it states that KPBSD recommends that the legislature explore a state-wide solution to health care costs for school districts and their employees.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE RECOMMENDATION

Maintain the adopted legislative priority on health care and encourage the legislature to use the recommendations of the Hay Report as reason to explore implementing a state-wide health care plan.
