ASAA Parent's Guide to Concussions in Sports (Revised 04/14)

What is a concussion?

 A concussion is a brain injury which results in a temporary disruption of normal brain function. The injury occurs when the brain is violently rocked back and forth or twisted inside the skull as a result of a direct or indirect force. An athlete does not have to lose consciousness ("knocked-out") to suffer a concussion. In fact only 3-10% of concussions do produce loss of consciousness.

Concussion Facts

- It is estimated that over 250,000 high school athletes across the United States suffer a concussion each year. (Data from NFHS Injury Surveillance System, 2010-2011). The CDC estimates 5.5 million sports concussions occur annually in the United States (CDC, 2011)
- Concussions occur most frequently in hockey and football, but girls' soccer, boys' soccer, and girls' basketball follow closely behind. All athletes are at risk.
- A concussion is a traumatic injury to the brain.
- Concussion symptoms may last from a few days to many months.
- Concussions can cause symptoms which interfere with school, work, and social life.
- An athlete should not return to sports when still having symptoms from a concussion as they are at risk for prolonging symptoms and at risk for sustaining additional, more serious, brain injury.
- A concussion may cause multiple symptoms. Many symptoms appear immediately after the injury, while others may develop over the next several days or weeks. The symptoms may be subtle and are often difficult to recognize.

What are the signs and symptoms of a concussion?

What should I do if I think my child has had a concussion?

If an athlete is suspected of having a concussion, he or she must be immediately removed from play, be it a game or practice Alaska Statute requires that (1) a student who is suspected of having sustained a concussion during a practice or game shall be immediately removed from the practice or game and (2) a student who has been removed from participation in a practice or game for a suspicion of a concussion may not return to participation in practice or game play until the student has been evaluated and cleared for participation in writing by an athletic trainer or other qualified person who has received training, as verified in writing or electronically by the qualified person, in the evaluation and management of concussions.

Continuing to participate in physical activity after a concussion can lead to worsening concussion symptoms, increased risk for further injury, and even death. Parents, coaches, and officials are not expected to be able to "diagnose" a concussion, as that is the job of a medical professional. However, you must be aware of the signs and symptoms of a concussion. And, if you suspect a concussion, then your child must stop playing:

When in doubt, sit them out!

All athletes who sustain a concussion need to be evaluated by a health care professional who is familiar with sports concussions. You should call your child's physician and explain what has happened and follow your physician's instructions. If your child is vomiting, has a severe headache, is having difficulty staying awake or answering simple questions he or she should be taken to the emergency department.

When can an athlete return to play following a concussion?

After it is determined that an athlete has suffered a concussion, the athlete may not return to play or participate until the athlete has completed the ASAA Return to Play Protocol. Previously, athletes were allowed to return to play if their symptoms resolved within 15 minutes of the injury. Studies have shown us that the young brain does not recover quickly enough for an athlete to return to activity safely in such a short time.

Concerns over athletes returning to play too quickly have led state lawmakers, in Alaska and most other states, to pass laws stating that no player shall return to play following a suspicion of concussion on that same day and the athlete

must be cleared by an appropriate health care professional before they are allowed to return to play in practices or games. The laws also mandate that coaches receive education on recognizing the signs and symptoms of concussion.

Where an athlete is evaluated as having suffered a concussion, only when an athlete has been completely free of concussion symptoms for 24 hours, are they eligible to be cleared to begin the Return to Play Protocol. The athlete should proceed with activity in a step-wise fashion to allow the brain to re-adjust to exertion. There is a minimum of 24 hours between steps in the Protocol. Some athletes complete one step each day. An individual athlete may be guided through the Protocol more slowly if they are at risk for prolonged concussion or additional brain injury. If symptoms recur during exercise, then exercise is ended and begins the next day at the preceding day's level.

Concussion Return to Play Protocol (ASAA, 2/18/2012)

- Symptomatic Stage:
 - Physical and Cognitive Rest.
 - Then Incremental Cognitive Work, without Provoking Symptoms.
 - If no symptoms, then:
- Day 1:
 - Begin when symptom free for 24 hours.
 - 15 min **light aerobic** activity (walk, swim, stationary bike, no resistance training).
 - If no symptoms, then:
- **Day 2:**
 - 30 min **light-mod aerobic** activity (jog, more intense walk, swim, stationary bike, no resistance training).
 - Start PE Class at previous day's activity level.
 - As RTP Protocol activity level increases, PE activity level remains one day behind.
 - If no symptoms, then:
- **Day 3:**

- 30 min mod-heavy aerobic activity (run, swim, cycle, skate, Nordic ski, no resistance training).
- If no symptoms, then:
- Day 4:
 - 30 min **heavy aerobic** (hard run, swim, cycle, skate, Nordic ski).
 - 15 min **Resistance Training** (push-up, sit-up, weightlifting)
 - If no symptoms, then:
- Day 5:
 - Return to Practice, Non-contact Limited Participation (Routine sport-specific drills).
 - If no symptoms, then:
- **Day 6:**
 - Return to Full-Contact Practice
 - If no symptoms, then:
- Day 7:
 - Medically Eligible for Competition when completes RTP Protocol and is cleared by Healthcare Professional
 - **ASAA Eligibility Criteria** must be met before return to competition.

If symptoms recur at any step, the athlete should cease activity and be reevaluated by their health care provider.

How can a concussion affect schoolwork?

Following a concussion, many athletes have difficulty with cognitive work: thinking, focusing attention, calculating, attending school, doing homework, taking tests. These problems may last from days to months and often involve difficulties with short and long-term memory, concentration, and organization.

Following concussion, athletes should begin with a period of rest, in which they avoid cognitive work. As concussion symptoms diminish and the athlete feels able, he/she can begin trials of cognitive work, e.g. reading, texting, computer, TV, videos, school. The introduction of cognitive work should be in short increments which increase progressively in length, so long as symptoms do not recur or worsen with the work. For example, start with 30 minutes of computer time, and, if symptoms do not worsen, try one hour later in the day. If several

hours of cognitive work are well tolerated at home, try attending a half day of school. When a full day of school is tolerated add homework.

Academic accommodations may be necessary for students attempting to attend school when they still have concussion symptoms. In many cases it is best to lessen the athlete's class load early on after the injury. This may include staying home from school for a few days, followed by a lightened schedule for a few days, or perhaps a longer period of time, if needed. Decreasing the stress on the brain early on after a concussion may lessen symptoms and shorten the recovery time. If cognitive work at any time provokes or exacerbates symptoms, then the work should be discontinued and there should be cognitive rest until the symptoms subside. The student can attempt to advance cognitive work again on the day following resolution of the increased symptoms.

What can I do?

- Learn to recognize the "Signs and Symptoms" of concussion as listed above.
- Emphasize to administrators, coaches, and other parents your concerns and expectations about concussion and safe play.
- Teach your athlete to tell the coaching staff if the athlete suspects that they or a teammate has a concussion.
- Monitor sports equipment for safety, fit, and maintenance.
- Ask teachers to monitor any decrease in grades or changes in behavior that could indicate concussion.
- Report concussions that occurred during the school year or over the summer to appropriate school staff. This will help in monitoring and protecting injured athletes as they move to the next season's sports.

Why is it so important that an athlete not return to play until they have completely recovered from a concussion?

Athletes who are not fully recovered from an initial concussion are significantly vulnerable for recurrent, cumulative, and even catastrophic consequences of a second concussive injury. The risk of such difficulties is diminished if the athlete is allowed time to recover from the concussion and return to play decisions are carefully made. No athlete should return-to-sport or other physical activity when symptoms of concussion are present.

Is a "CAT scan" or MRI needed to diagnose a concussion?

Diagnostic imaging tests, which include CT ("CAT") and MRI scans, are rarely needed following a concussion. While these are helpful in identifying life-threatening brain injuries (e.g. skull fracture, bleeding, swelling), the tests are typically normal, even in athletes who have sustained a severe concussion. A

concussion is diagnosed based upon the athlete's story of the injury and a physical examination.

What is the best treatment to help my child recover more quickly from a concussion?

The best treatment for a concussion is rest. There are no medications that can speed the recovery from a concussion. Exposure to loud noises, bright lights, computers, video games, television and phones (including text messaging) all may worsen the symptoms of a concussion. You should allow your child to rest as much as possible in the days following a concussion. As the symptoms lessen, you can allow increased access to computers, video games, etc., but the access must be lessened if symptoms worsen.

How long do the symptoms of a concussion usually last?

The symptoms of a concussion will usually go away within two weeks of the initial injury. However, in some cases, symptoms may last for several weeks, or even months. Symptoms such as headache, memory problems, poor concentration, and mood changes can interfere with school, work, and social interactions. The potential for such long-term symptoms and disability underscores the need for careful management of all concussions.

How many concussions can an athlete have before he or she should stop playing sports?

There is no "magic number" of concussions that determine when an athlete should give up playing contact or collision sports. The circumstances surrounding each individual injury, such as mechanism of injury and length of symptoms following the concussion, are very important and must be considered when assessing an athlete's risk for further and potentially more serious concussions. The decision to "retire" from sports can only be reached following a thorough review of the athlete's concussion history, coupled with a thorough and frank discussion between you, your doctor, and your child.

I've read recently that concussions may cause long-term brain damage in professional athletes. Is this a risk for high school athletes who have had a concussion?

The issue of "chronic encephalopathy" in some former NFL and NHL players has received much media attention. Very little is known about what may be causing dramatic abnormalities in their brains. These players had long professional careers after playing in high school and college. In most cases, they played more than 20 years and suffered multiple concussions in addition to thousands of other blows to their heads. Alcohol, steroid, and other drug use may also have contributed to the brain changes. The average high school athlete does not

accumulate nearly the number of potentially injurious blows to the brain as a professional player. But we know that the teenage brain is much more vulnerable to injury and to more severe injury than the older brain. And the fact that we know very little about the long-term effects of concussions in young athletes is further reason to very carefully manage each and every concussion.

What will happen when my child completes the Return To Play Protocol?

When the Return to Play Protocol has been successfully completed, the athlete will be examined by the responsible healthcare provider. Additional tests may be appropriate. The provider will sign a medical clearance to resume competition. The Return To Play Protocol together with medical examination is the internationally recognized process by which concussed athletes are returned to athletic participation as safely as possible. Completing the Return to Play Protocol and medical examination does not mean that the brain has fully recovered from concussion or that there is not risk in returning to competition. But it is the safest way that physicians know at this time. Participation in athletics is accompanied by risk of injury, permanent disability, and death. Having recently sustained a concussion, an athlete is at increased risk for another head injury. Once the athlete is medically eligible to return to competition, the parent and athlete will be asked to sign consent, accepting the risk in returning to play.

Re: Participation in ASCD Annual Conference

Having just returned from the ASCD Annual Conference held in Houston, I wanted to take the opportunity to update you and the other members of the school board on this valuable opportunity. Resources are always limited and it's vital for you to have information as you make decisions so I wanted you to know firsthand about the benefits of attending such a conference.

I was able to take three members of my school's Leadership Team with me to the conference. We attended a three day pre-conference entitled, "Teaching Up! Equity and Education for All" and also attended the first day of the three day conference. It was so valuable to attend the conference as a team as it allowed us to immediately discuss, digest, and plan for using the ideas in our school.

"Teaching Up" focused on the concept of providing an equitable education for all students and a continued reminder that it is our responsibility to educate all students regardless of any barriers they may bring with them to school. A key point in the presentation was the concept that "equitable" and "equal" are not synonymous and in fact may and probably should look different for each learner. The analogy that best fits is everybody needs a shoe that is most suited to them rather than the same shoe for all. The shoe also needs to have room to grow so the idea is a mindset of continued growth for both student and teacher.

The keynote speaker was Sarah Bliss, a Harvard professor and author of the book "The Rise". Ms. Bliss was absolutely one of the most brilliant individuals I have ever had the opportunity to listen to. She has an undergraduate degree in art history and a doctorate in philosophy from Harvard. The premise of her speech was that trying and not finding success is not really a failure. In fact, that negative result is an opportunity to learn and it ties directly into the growth mindset. This has direct applicability to schools. We need to purposefully teach and model to our students that the true kernel of learning is in the trying and the analysis of your results rather than a feeling of defeat if "success" as we typically define it is not achieved.

Other sessions from the conference included information on the flipped classroom, teacher evaluation, how to specifically teach to the needs of boys, and scaffolding learning for students' needs. My leadership team and I would be very happy to share our experiences with other KPBSD schools that may be interested.

I attended the Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Summit Conference by Solution Tree in Phoenix with staff from Skyview Middle School, Soldotna High School, Nikiski middle/High School, and Homer High School. Not only were administrators present from the four schools, but teachers from three of the school also attended. This was a tremendous opportunity to further the PLC growth that is =being implemented into the schools; specifically at Skyview Middle School and Soldotna High School. We were able to visit and chew on ideas that were presented which led to a very significant and beneficial experience.

A main component that I was looking for in attending was how was the administrator to function among the various PLC's that the school has. In the past I have been the keeper of the data and I would disaggregate it and then spew it out to the teachers with what I felt was the most relevant or in need of attention. How do I just give this to the teachers without feeling like I have lost something or put more on their plate which is full? I also was looking for information about the length of time and how the PLC's should be structured. I had read about these things, but to be able to see real world examples and have teachers there to see them to show that it works was insightful and had a good impact.

The commitment for the whole team is vital. I see that there has not been this commitment in the past and I was impressed with how the DuFour's discussed different strategies for the administrator to build a common vision for the PLC process. Critical questions to ask each team and they have to have the answers. The questions are part of building a results-orientated culture and I need to be able to lead them through so as to setting attainable goals.

In order for the teachers to use data, they have to have data to look at and it has to be an accurate reflection of the students' knowledge. This poses a problem when the teachers are not tightly coupled in their lessons. Common formative assessments are going to be necessary for the teachers to be able to reflect on lessons and student growth within their classes. PLC's will provide the avenue in which they will be able to do this.

The golden calf that seems to be at SOHI is the master schedule. There has not been time built into the day for the teachers to meet with their PLC groups. I am using what I have learned and the conversations I have had with other administrators within our own district and from the conference to make a new master schedule that will allow the PLC groups to have a meeting once a week. I feel that this will show the teachers that I am serious about this and am willing to make sacrifices to ensure that it is happening.

The hardest part of going to a conference of this type is the sheer volume of information that is hard. It is impossible to see every presenter and receive all of the information. I plan on continuing my learning of PLC and collaboration in order to be an effective leader for the staff for the years to come at Soldotna High School.

Litigation Status Report

Following is a summary of the major lawsuits in which the borough and school district are involved. This list does not include the real property tax foreclosures and numerous standard tax collection cases pursued by the borough.

- Anderson v. Kenai Peninsula Borough School District and Todd Syverson. Case No. 3KN-14-857 CI. Robert and Yvonne Anderson filed suit against the school district on October 2, 2014, claiming damages for the district's alleged failure to prevent purported harassment and bullying of their daughter by other students. The district and Mr. Syverson filed an answer denying their claims. Trial is being scheduled for the spring of 2016. Discovery is in process.
- 2. **King v. Kenai Peninsula Borough.** Case No. 3KN-14-310 CI. Latasha King filed suit against the borough on April 7, 2014, for damages allegedly sustained in a motor vehicle accident on a borough maintained road. The borough filed an answer and a crossclaim against the driver of the vehicle. As plaintiff settled with the driver the parties have agreed to dismiss the driver from the lawsuit. Investigation and discovery are continuing.

3.	Reekie v. KPBSD, et al. Case no. 3HO-13-67 CI. Justin Reekie, Raymond Reekie and Shawn Leigh Reekie filed suit against the school district, the American Legion, Department of Alaska, Inc. and numerous other entities and individuals for damages allegedly sustained by Justin during baseball batting practice held at Homer High School on March 24, 2010. A mediation was held October 6, 2014, but no settlement was reached. Discovery is continuing and trial has been rescheduled to August 3, 2015.

INFORMATION Alaska Measures of Progress (AMP) Assessment

Soldotna, April 2, 2015—The annual student assessment required by state law to meet federal requirements takes place for our students in grades 3 through 10 between March 30 and May 1, 2015. In 2015, the Alaska Measures of Progress (AMP) assessment replaced the Standards Based Assessment (SBA). With AMP, students will take two tests—English language arts and math--instead of three, with fewer questions overall.*

Several questions have been asked about the type of data and personal information that is collected in the AMP assessment—it is the same as has been collected by SBAs and other state assessments since 2005. To note:

- "Basic student information and student test scores are collected. Basic student information includes
 the student's name, Alaska student ID number, and specific demographic information. EED does not
 collect sensitive information such as physical addresses, mailing addresses, or Social Security
 numbers."*
- "No data about individual students is ever given to the federal government. No data is sold to companies."*
- "Individual student test data is provided to the student's school district to inform instruction. Only authorized school district staff that have a legitimate educational interest (such as the student's teacher or principal) may see a student's data."*
- All data is protected by the <u>Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)</u>, the federal law
 protecting the privacy of student education records, and that governs student data and what can be
 collected and reported.

Collective Bargaining Update

Soldotna, April 16, 2015—The Kenai Peninsula Borough School District (KPBSD) began Collective Bargaining negotiations with the Kenai Peninsula Education Association (KPEA), and the Kenai Peninsula Education Support Association (KPESA) in February 2015, and met four times before impasse was declared on April 15, 2015. The next step is mediation. The Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service (FMCS) has been contacted and will appoint a mediator. KPBSD is hopeful that the mediator can offer assistance to craft a mutually agreed upon negotiated contract.

The District believes that given the state's fiscal process and current reality, we are far apart from KPEA and KPESA negotiators in our thinking and methodology, thus it is time to work through a mediator who will come to an analysis within the current reality we face. Our budget is based on revenues without certainty from the Governor or legislature about education funding. The District does not believe that our current offer to KPEA and KPESA would result in the elimination of staff positions or reduce services to our students.

KPBSD offer to KPEA and KPESA

A one year contract, accounted for in the FY16 budget was passed by the Board of Education on April 6, 2015. The offer includes:

- Annual movement on the salary schedule for all eligible employees
 - Certified employees (teachers) receive 1.78% 4.82%. Average increase is 2.67%
 - Classified employees (support staff) receive 3.44% 12.35%. Average increase (after initial step in year one) is 4.12%
- A \$500 signing bonus outside the salary schedule for all fulltime employees; a pro-rated signing bonus for part-time employees
- The addition of a high-deductible healthcare plan option added to the current traditional healthcare plan

KPBSD values its excellent employees, seeks to provide stability and certainty for staff, students, and families, and is committed to our offer of eligible movement on the salary schedule, a signing bonus outside of the salary schedule for all employees, and more options in our self-funded healthcare plan.

Soldotna, April 10, 2015—The Senate and House Conference Committee for <u>HB 72</u> Operating Budget formed. The <u>first meeting is Friday, April 10, 2015</u>, at 4:00 PM.

- KPBSD understands that difficult financial decisions have to be made. We have confidence in our legislators and Speaker of the House Chenault, who have demonstrated support and advocacy for public education on the Kenai Peninsula.
- Over 80 percent of our 2015-2016 budget is related to staff (salary and benefits). The proposed reductions of \$8 million translates into the potential loss of up to 100 positions and vital programs.
- It is a constitutional responsibility of the State of Alaska to provide and maintain a public school system open to every child.

Principal Nate Crabtree, K-Beach Elementary: "Legislators are proposing additional reductions to education funding. Our children have one chance for a K-12 education and it needs to be the best we can provide. KPBSD is committed to delivering a quality education to our students and providing stability for our staff and communities. Unanticipated education funding reductions, proposed this late in the budgeting process, will have an impact on K-Beach Elementary. While it is imperative that we find ways to save money as a state, we need to carefully consider doing so in a way that doesn't negatively influence students during these very formative years when the emerging skills of reading, writing, and math are taking root. Please consider ways in which you can positively influence legislators. Time is essential; the legislative session ends April 19, 2015."

Principal Dan Carstens, Nikiski Middle-High School: "When I learned of the possible additional reduction to the BSA [Foundation Formula 4.1% reduction], I was taken aback and immediately examined my current staffing sheet to determine what else could go. It came down to programs and opportunities for our students. ... I looked at our Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs and would have to have lighter versions due to the fact that our instructors would need to teach a wider variety at mainly a beginning level. In other words, not a deep understanding, only introductory. Which would be a shame, especially with the variety of equipment we currently possess."

Soldotna High School student council: "We, the students of Soldotna High School Student Council would like to address the current status of HB72 as it stands on April 8, 2015. We are gravely concerned about the educational implications of this bill if it should pass as it currently exists. ... We would encourage you to continue to look at a variety of ways to help balance the budget without such extreme cuts to education."*

Proposed reduction to education funding in Alaska

Soldotna, April 3, 2015—The Senate Finance Committee has amended <u>HB 72</u>, proposing a 4.1 percent reduction to the *Foundation Formula* educational funding. The reduction to the state contribution also impacts the maximum allowable contribution the Kenai Peninsula Borough (KPB) can contribute to the school district. KPBSD is analyzing the potential impact of this additional reduction in revenue to our 2015-2016 budget, together with our commitment to provide stability for our students, staff, and community within the changing fiscal climate. The impact of the unanticipated <u>HB 72</u> reductions to the KPBSD budget are:

Senate Finance Committee proposed education Foundation Formula reduction of 4.1 percent:

- Reduces state contribution to KPBSD: \$4,238,432
- Reduces local (borough) contribution to KPBSD: \$977,007

Governor Walker's proposed operating budget reduction of educational One-Time Funding:

- Reduces state contribution to KPBSD: \$2,262,989
- Reduces local (borough) contribution to KPBSD: \$520,487

Potential FY16 revenue loss: \$7,998,915

Total possible reduction in state funding to KPBSD: \$6,501,421 Total possible reduction in local (borough) funding to KPBSD: \$1,497,494

"I'm very concerned that the legislature is proposing these further reductions to education funding, particularly this late in our process of budgeting and staffing for next year," said Superintendent Sean Dusek. "KPBSD is committed to deliver a quality education to our students, and provide stability for our staff and communities. These reductions compromise our ability to prepare our students for their future. We will discuss the budget and potential ramifications with the school board during a previously scheduled worksession on Monday, April 6, 2015."

Over 80 percent of the 2015-2016 budget is related to staff (salary and benefits). An \$8 million reduction translates into the potential loss of up to 100 positions.

KPBSD launches new system to accept online payments

Soldotna, April 21, 2015—"Mom, I forgot my lunch money!" Have you ever wanted to add money to a school meal account, for a student activity fee, donation, or lost book via an online payment? Now you can! KPBSD is working with RevTrak, which allows parents and other interested parties to make online payments to the school district, via a computer or mobile device.

Food service payments

Online payment for food services is now available for all KPBSD schools. Online payments are processed in real time; this means that someone could make a payment in the morning, and the funds would be available for the student when he or she goes to lunch that day.

Student activity fees

Kenai Central High School and Ninilchik School are piloting the receipt of online payments for student activities, such as class fees, activity participation fees, donations, lost book fees and so forth. Additional schools are going live in coming weeks.

To make a payment

Parents or other people making payments or donations can access a student record in three ways to make payments:

- Use of the PowerSchool parent portal
- Through the KPBSD website online payments link on the <u>Students-Parents tab</u>
- Via the online payments icon on the KPBSD mobile app

"The district has had many requests for some type of online payment capability, so we are glad to be able to offer this service for students and we hope it will be helpful," said Laurie Olson, director of finance. "Liz Hayes in our finance department together with Eric Soderquist and David Henson in information services have worked since last summer to get this online and functioning; they are the main reason we are able to offer this service."

There is a 3.61% processing fee calculated on all payments, no exceptions. This is the actual cost of the processing fee from RevTrak, and is not a source of revenue for the district.
